Forms of Academic Assessments	<p>Parker Elementary has common formative assessments that every teacher gives. Students in Kinder-6th grade are assessed to determine baseline data and to determine growth throughout the year via the same assessment, MAP. Pre-Kindergarten students are assessed using CLI assessment to determine numeracy and phonetic mastery. Students in Kinder-6th are also assessed using curriculum based assessments that are STAAR aligned. Previous STAAR tests are released which are utilized for assessment and instruction in addition to other curriculums.</p>			
Expected Achievement levels on academic assessments	<p>The State's Performance Standards can be found on this website: https://tea.texas.gov/student-assessment/testing/staar/staar-performance-standards Parker Elementary tracks each child's growth throughout the year via local assessments (mentioned above). Each child has a data folder where teachers help them track their own learning growth.</p>
