Redlands High School is located in the city of Redlands, San Bernardino County, California. RHS is one of three comprehensive 4-year high schools in the Redlands Unified School District. Founded in 1891, it is the oldest public high school in the State of California still functioning on its original site. The ethnic/racial makeup of the student population is 46.8% Hispanic, 19.8% White, 13.1% Asian, .14% American Indian, .38% Pacific Islander, 4.1% Filipino, 5.3% Black and 6.7% Multi-Ethnic. The school is enrolled in the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs called the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) which means that all enrolled students in the school, regardless of income level, are eligible to receive a healthy school breakfast and school lunch at no cost. Total student enrollment is 2099.

FOCUS ON ACADEMICS RHS is committed to providing all students with a rigorous learning environment in order to fully develop their potential. To support these efforts, staff members consistently analyze student results to make revisions as needed in programs, curricula, and instruction. The school counseling program consists of a Multi-Tiered Systems of Supports (MTSS) to address the academic, college and career, and social/emotional needs of ALL students. In addition, ALL students have access to and the support of a credentialed career center teacher and one credentialed teacher librarian. RHS programs include AVID (9-12) and an award-winning CA Partnership Academy: HEART Academy.. Each student is issued their own district-monitored Chromebook.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS OF EXCELLENCE

HEART Academy: The HEART Academy is a health career oriented program that offers students academic and technical preparation for college entrance and employment in selected healthcare fields.

LINK CREW: Link Crew is a high school transition program that aids Freshman in a smooth transition into high school. It's built on the belief that students can help students succeed. Link Crew trains members of the junior and senior classes to be Link Leaders.

AVID: Approximately 222 students are participating in the four-year AVID program at RHS. AVID seeks to ensure that students in the academic middle are equipped with the skills necessary to be successful in college.

DUAL ENROLLMENT : Dual Enrollment courses are taken in partnership with Crafton Hills College and earn 10 high school credits per semester. DE courses are placed on transcripts as **unweighted** in calculating GPA.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

Community and district support of the school has enabled Redlands High School to maintain excellent academic, athletic and co-curricular programs.

The Athletic Program: 25 varsity teams competed in the Citrus Belt League while maintaining an average varsity team GPA of over a 3.36. Varsity teams won six CBL titles in 2024-25.

The Vocal Music Department provides a comprehensive program of vocal and choral music, arranged so that any student at RHS who wants to experience singing may do so. The six choral ensembles consistently receive superior ratings at festivals and competitions for their excellence and musicality, and continue to represent RHS and our community with pride and distinction.

Instrumental Music Program: The Marching Band performs at football games, school rallies, and competitions throughout California. The Wind Ensemble, Symphonic Band, String Ensemble, and Jazz Band have performed and competed throughout the United States and Europe, and the Color Guard and Percussion Ensembles have competed at the international level. Instrumental ensembles at RHS consistently receive Superior and Unanimous Superior ratings at festivals.

Theatre Arts (Masquers) are a part of the THEATRE ARTS COMPANY (TACo), a student-run organization promoting theatre on the RHS Campus. Masquers regularly attend the annual State Thespian Conference and have earned several scholarships and awards. Each year, our theater group presents a minimum of three theatrical performances.

The Speech & Debate Team had a successful year in 2024-25. They took 2nd place in the school sweepstakes in the CBSR league. They tied for 8th out of 178 teams in state championships. In addition, the team earned over 100 individual awards through the season.

The Mock Trial Team won the San Bernardino county competition for an 18th time. The 31 students earned 24 outstanding performance awards in pretrial, prosecution & defense attorneys, prosecution & defense witnesses, clerk, bailiff, and 1st place in courtroom artist. RHS students earned 7 of the 8 "Best in the County" awards and finished 12th out of almost 500 mock trial teams in California.
