CURRICULUM

Kents Hill School operates on a semester system. Students are typically enrolled in 6 courses, though some students are permitted to enroll in 5 courses with permission from the Dean of Academics. Most Kents Hill students advance well beyond the basic graduation requirements.

SIGNATURE PROGRAMS

Our program blends traditional disciplines with a distinctive, future-focused education. Learning is grounded, connected, and experiential—helping students think critically, communicate effectively, and lead with purpose while doing meaningful work.

From Outing Club adventures to field studies on invasive species, oysters, and civil rights, students learn by doing through **Outdoor and Experiential Learning**.

Through **Summit**, upperclassmen design projects or experiences to explore interests, work with professionals, and produce work that matters.

The **Akin Learning Center** provides wrap-around academic support to help every student thrive.

Challenging offerings include **Advanced Placement (AP)** and **Dual-Enrollment** classes.

Our **Advisory Program** builds lasting connections, pairing each student with a dedicated faculty advisor for guidance and support in all aspects of life at Kents Hill.
