About Us

A California Gold Ribbon School, Aragon is a comprehensive public high school located in San Mateo, a city of 105,000 residents midway between San Francisco and the Silicon Valley, serving 1656 students with a graduating class size of 426. As one of ten schools within the San Mateo Union High School District (SMUHSD), Aragon draws from San Mateo as well as its surrounding cities as part of the SMUHSD open enrollment policy. Our students are diverse- 29% Asian, 26% White, 21% Hispanic, and 24% other race/ethnicities. Aragon High School has the highest transfer request rate in the district due to our rigorous academics, excellent performing arts and athletics, and supportive community.

Academics

The academic calendar is two semesters of 18 weeks. Classes are held on a block schedule. We offer a 7-period day schedule, but highly recommend 9th grade students to take six classes. Sophomores and juniors take six or seven classes. Seniors must take at least four classes, but a minimum of five is encouraged.

Our academic program meets the diverse needs and interests of our students by offering a varied course of study that includes AVID, career and technical education (CTE), honors, and Advanced Placement courses. Academic support classes include- Self and Social Empowerment (formerly known as Guided Studies), and Community Literacy in Action (CLA). Advanced Standing (AS) classes are offered in 9th and 10th grade English and 10th grade History classes. These classes provide additional rigor to students who wish to challenge themselves; these are non-weighted classes. Aragon offers a variety of STEM courses; students may only take one Math and one Science course each year.

The Total GPA are cumulative and include all classes in which a student receives a final A-F grade. If the course is repeated, the higher grade is counted. Credit is awarded only once. The weighted Total GPA is according to the California public university (A-G) system using a 4.0 grading scale, adding an extra point to classes designated with an H or AP when the student has earned a final grade of "C" or higher. Dual enrollment courses are given an extra point in the GPA in addition to college credit. **Aragon does not calculate class rank.**

Aragon offers a rigorous college preparatory program that challenges and supports students at every course level. We encourage students to take advantage of the rich opportunities we offer so they may best prepare themselves for their postsecondary path of interest while maintaining health and balance during high school.

Academic Supports & Extracurriculars

Aragon High School is committed to providing an inclusive academic learning environment for all students. Aragon strives to support the Tier 1 needs of all students in classroom instruction. Flex time is also embedded into the school day for a forty-five minute period every Wednesday and Friday, giving students time to work with teachers and support their own academic achievement.

The school library is open after school daily. Students are welcomed and encouraged to attend for individual or group tutoring supports. The Wellness Center is also open daily for students to take breaks or check in with staff.

For students requiring additional academic, behavioral, or social-emotional supports, we offer short-term Tier 2 interventions including Homework Organization Progress Success (HOPS), Check In Check Out (CICO) mentoring, Substance Use Program, and attendance supports.

Half of Aragon's students (n=833) participate in at least one school sport, including our 25 varsity, 18 junior varsity, 2 freshmen teams and our sideline cheer and dance teams. Our music program is award-winning, including the California State Chapter of the Year and Tri-M Music Honor Society. We also have over 80 student-led clubs.

Curriculum & Grading

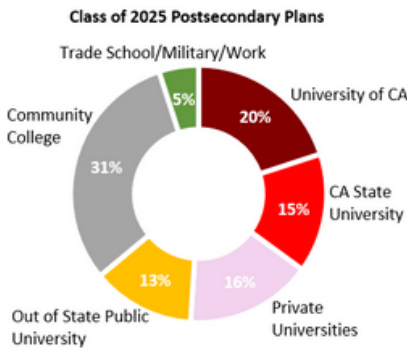
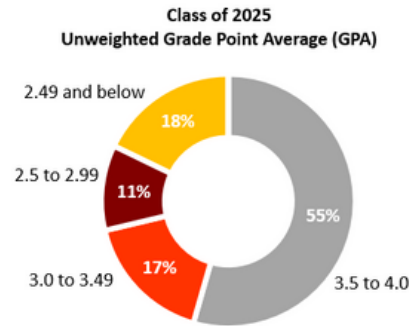
Students in SMUHSD must earn 220 units to graduate, and credits are earned 5 units per course per semester. All courses fulfilling graduation requirements must be taken on campus. With prior approval, students may take up to 40 elective credits off campus for courses not offered on campus.

Grade Point Average (GPA) and Postsecondary Plans

About 55% of Aragon students have a unweighted GPA between 3.5 and 4.0. Over one third (35%) of Aragon students attend a UC or CSU after graduation, 16% attend private universities, and 13% attend out of state public universities. An additional 31% attend community college. See below for the full unweighted GPA distribution for grades 9-12 and student reported postsecondary plans of our Class of 2025.



Standardized Testing

California public colleges and universities continue to be test blind for Fall 2026 admission. Standardized testing options in the Bay Area have decreased for students since covid closures. In response, the SMUHSD hosts a PSAT and two SAT testing administrations for its 11th and 12th grade students.
