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Our Community

St. Xavier High School, founded in 1831, is a Catholic college preparatory school for young men conducted by the Society of Jesus (Jesuits). Students enrolled at St. Xavier reside in all areas of greater Cincinnati, including northern Kentucky and southeastern Indiana. The student body is approximately 80 percent Roman Catholic. The remaining 20 percent of students includes other Christian denominations and the Jewish, Hindu, Buddhist, and Islamic faiths. The student body is 21% racially and ethnically diverse.

GRADUATE AT GRADUATION

To guide every facet of curriculum development at St. Xavier, the faculty has produced this summary statement of the characteristics that the graduate will have acquired during his time at the school. ADMISSION

Admission to St. Xavier is selective based upon a qualifying examination and previous academic performance.

FINANCIAL AID

77% percent of the students receive tuition assistance through St. Xavier's financial aid program. Last year students were awarded 5.7 million dollars in financial aid.

SIZE AND ACADEMIC RIGOR

Young men at St. Xavier High School are enrolled in an authentic college preparatory program. Historically, 99 percent of graduates each year enter a four-year college or university program.

ACCREDITATION

St. Xavier High School is accredited by the Ohio Catholic School Accrediting Association, AdvancED, and the Ohio Department of Education.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

23.5 units are required for graduation:

- 4 units of English
- 4 units of Mathematics
- 4 units of Religious Education
- 3 units of World Language (all in the same language)
- 3 units of Social Studies
- 3 units of Science (Biology, Chemistry, Physics)
- 1 unit of Fine Arts
- ½ unit of Physical Education
- ½ unit of Health
- ½ unit of Financial Literacy
- ¼ unit of Oral Communication
- ¼ unit of Computer Science

SCHOOL POLICIES

- St. Xavier High School uses a weighted 4-point scale. All classes are computed in the GPA.
- We do not disclose disciplinary matters.

COLLEGE CREDIT PLUS

St. Xavier HS provides students the opportunity to earn dual enrollment college credit through the College Credit Plus (CCP) program. All CCP classes are taught by credentialed St. Xavier faculty and are held at St. Xavier HS.

IMPORTANT NOTES ABOUT STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

- Advanced Placement courses are ordinarily available *ONLY TO JUNIORS AND SENIORS*. Select freshmen are placed in AP World History. Admission to these courses is competitive and is based upon past performance/testing, and, in all cases, approval of the Instructor.
- Even the most rigorous senior schedule would rarely include more than 3-4 AP courses.
- Junior students may elect to enroll in United States History/Morality which is both a social studies class (US History) and a Religion class (Morality and Social Justice). This class also has a community service component.
