

Facts about Williamson

The Williamson Central School District is located 22 miles east of Rochester and includes most of the township of Williamson along with parts of Marion, Ontario and Sodus. The district encompasses 36 square miles and stretches northward to Lake Ontario. It offers urban availability with a beautiful rural setting. A variety of cultural, educational and recreational opportunities are available in the area.

Employment opportunities include Rochester industries such as University of Rochester, Rochester Regional Health, Wegmans Food Markets Inc., and Xerox Corp. Local employers include Dr. Pepper Snapple Group, and Baldwin Richardson Foods Co. Agriculture is vital in the area with dairy and fruit farming topping the list.
