

Why Are We Here?

- Broward County Public Schools, like many districts across South Florida, is facing a significant decline in student enrollment.
- Over the past year, District-managed schools' enrollment declined by
 9,987 students (5.04%) from the 2024-25 to 2025-26 school year.
- Over the past 10 years, District-managed schools declined by 37,707
 students (16.72%) from 2015-16 to 2025-26 school year.
- □ These changes are not isolated—they reflect broader trends in family choices, community needs, and educational expectations.








Our Greater Challenge

- Enrollment loss affects how we fund, staff, and operate our schools.
- Over the past year, District-managed schools' enrollment loss
 equates to a funding decrease of approximately \$90,531,456.
- Over the past 10 years, District-managed schools' enrollment loss
 equates to a funding decrease of approximately \$341,811,316.
- This fiscal reality impacts course offerings, programs, and student opportunities.







August 26, 2025 School Board Workshop Synopsis


- Staff presented an overview of schools to be addressed this year, based on Policy 8010, School and community requests.
- The School Board reached consensus on:
 - Schools to be addressed
 - Timeline for the process
 - Stakeholder engagement plan
 - Composition of the School Boundary Committee
 - Key considerations for evaluating proposals
- Community meetings are scheduled to receive input on redefining options for identified schools.
- The School Board and Superintendent reaffirmed their commitment to an inclusive process that values every stakeholder's voice.






Our Shared Purpose
