Granada High School develops caring, knowledgeable, and active lifelong learners ready to contribute and thrive in an interconnected and changing world.


COMMUNITY

WEIGHTED GRADES


Honors, AP and IB courses receive an extra grade point in weighted GPA calculations. No additional Honors/AP/IB point is given for grades of D or below.

CLASS OF 2025 GRADUATION RATE




CAMPUS INFORMATION
