








On November 4, 2025, Ionia Public Schools voters will consider a bond proposal for district-wide improvements to our aging buildings.

If approved, the bond would provide \$84,500,000 for facility needs with a zero-mill increase to the current tax rate.



Safety & Security

Ensuring there are secure entrance vestibules district-wide, upgrading doors, locks, and building access, and improving fire alarm systems

Modern Infrastructure

Equipping aging elementary buildings with learning environments for today's teaching and learning in layout, furniture, and equipment

Air Quality Improvements

Implementing air conditioning district-wide to improve student focus, avoid school cancellations, and recruit and retain high-quality staff

Right-Sized Facilities

Retiring the 103 year-old Emerson building, which cannot be renovated for best practices in safety and security, and providing students and staff with safer, more modern spaces by building a new wing at Boyce

Theater, Band & Choir

Responding to community prioritization of a new 900-seat Performing Arts Center for student and community use, replacing the aging Watt Auditorium

Improvements without increasing the millage rate

If approved, the bond would have a zero-mill increase over the current millage rate, expected to maintain the existing rate of 7.72 mills.





Why a bond proposal now?

IPS has facilities that are over 100 years old.

Through multiple surveys, public meetings, and engagement with focus groups, our community has prioritized updated spaces that **BETTER SUPPORT OUR STUDENTS, STAFF, AND COMMUNITY.**

For years, we have worked diligently to steward our aging buildings, addressing our most pressing issues through a community-approved sinking fund. However, **AS OUR FACILITIES CONTINUE TO AGE, THE LIST OF NEEDS GROWS.**

If approved, there would be an expected **zero-mill increase to the current millage rate**.

IPS currently levies a 7.72 bond millage rate. If not approved, we could not fund the building improvement projects necessary to operate our district at our desired standards.

The proposal would allow a millage rate extension, with zero mill increase, to address facility needs.

UPDATES FROM SUPERINTENDENT GURK

To continue implementing our IPS Strategic Plan and strengthen students' social-emotional resilience, IPS staff participated in a summer book study and read *The Anxious Generation* by Dr. Jonathan Haidt. As an educator and a parent, this book was very beneficial. Dr. Haidt explains how overprotectiveness in the real world (i.e., prohibiting kids from unstructured outdoor play), combined with underprotection in the virtual world (i.e., giving smartphones to children), has resulted in staggering rates of anxiety, depression, and self-harm. *The Anxious Generation* has valuable suggestions and solutions for parents, educators, technology companies, and lawmakers. This summer, our dedicated maintenance teams and Mr. Avery completed numerous essential projects. These included installing new playground equipment at Emerson and Boyce Elementary, updating the D.R. Welch bathrooms, refinishing the IHS gym floor, and installing a new water line at IHS. They also performed primary maintenance on the bus fleet and all of our schools' HVAC systems, replaced the IMS cafeteria window sill, sealed Jefferson Elementary's south wall, repaired sanitary sewers at Boyce Elementary restrooms, and refreshed hallways, classrooms, and workspaces with new paint and carpet district-wide. We also conducted successful fire extinguisher and AHERA inspections.

We are proud of gritty IHS student Will Wilson, who recently earned his Eagle Scout rank. In addition to demonstrating leadership qualities, he led a community service project at Bertha Brock Park wherein he installed a retaining wall and handrail along the steps behind the Palmer Lodge.




