1. Narrative description of the Prop 28 arts education program(s) funded. (2500 character limit).

Our district has strategically invested Prop 28 funds to provide students with meaningful and equitable access to Visual and Performing Arts (VAPA). Across 25 programs, students in Transitional Kindergarten through Eighth Grade are engaging in music and visual arts experiences that build skills year by year, foster creativity, and connect learning to cultural and academic contexts. At 20 elementary schools, Prop 28 funds support VAPA Career Specialists who design grade-level projects incorporating historical and cultural perspectives. Monthly and quarterly projects span the arts continuum, giving students exposure to diverse art forms. Funding also provides materials and supplies so every child can fully participate in the artistic process. At our five junior high schools, Prop 28 funds support credentialed teachers who expand elective offerings in visual and performing arts. Junior high students benefit from daily opportunities to explore and deepen their engagement in a variety of art forms. Each program is guided by local community input and tailored to school needs. Some programs emphasize the visual arts, allowing students to explore media, techniques, and themes connected to California's Visual Arts Standards and core academics. Others highlight music or the performing arts, offering students rich opportunities to perform and create. Together, these 25 Prop 28 programs provide comprehensive, developmental, and enriching arts education. Students gain technical skills while also growing as creative thinkers, problem solvers, and collaborators. By weaving in cross-curricular connections, the programs deepen academic learning and foster appreciation for the arts as a vital part of personal expression and community identity. Through these efforts, our district is building a strong foundation for students to thrive artistically and academically, preparing them for future learning and a lifelong engagement with the arts.
