



25-26 HHS Student Expectations & Procedures

Here at Hahnville High School, our theme for the 2025-2026 school year is to “**Accept the Challenge.**” As a collective Tiger Family, we are committed to remaining Fierce. Noble. Strong. Together! As such, we believe in our HHS students’ commitment to meeting the following expectations:

- **Student Expectation #1: Students are expected to embody professionalism in speech and appearance at all times.**
- **Student Expectation #2: Students are expected to practice responsible digital citizenship, including the use of technology at appropriate times.**
- **Student Expectation #3: Students are expected to be in-class at all times, except when provided with an approved hall pass.**
- **Student Expectation #4: Students are expected to be alert and actively engaged in learning.**
- **Student Expectation #5: Students are expected to exhibit self-discipline, maintain composure, and practice appropriate conflict resolution skills at all times.**

Please reference the specific procedures and guidance below as it pertains to our five student expectations:

25-26 HHS Dress Code

- Please see below for the Hahnville High School student dress code:
 - Students may only wear khaki or navy blue pants, shorts, or skirts.
 - Shorts and skirts must be no shorter than 2 inches above the knee
 - No jeans, leggings, or athletic pants are allowed, unless specifically permitted.
 - Approved shirts include: white or purple collared shirts, Satellite Center shirts, HHS Student of the Month shirts, or the approved HHS uniform t-shirts (please see below).



- Other HHS-related shirts may be worn at specified days only (e.g. HHS School Spirit day, etc.).
 - Due to safety concerns, shirts must remain tucked during the school day.
 - Outerwear that does not zip or button all the way down the front must be solid purple, white, OR Hahnville-related.
 - Long-sleeve shirts do not constitute outerwear.
 - **No hooded garments are permitted at any point during the school day.**
 - Hats may be worn outside of school buildings during inclement weather. Hats worn indoors will be confiscated.



- Due to safety concerns, all shoes must have a hard sole and a secure back strap or heel. No Crocs/croc-like shoes, slides, house slippers, or flip-flops are allowed.
- If a student is not wearing an appropriate shirt, bottoms, or footwear, the illegal item will be confiscated and an appropriate item issued (if available and applicable). The confiscated item will be returned to the student at the end of the school day.
 - Students who are issued a replacement sweatshirt will have \$5 charged to his or her fees. All fees must be paid in full prior to purchasing tickets to any school dances.
- Any student failing to comply by the stated guidelines will be sent to In-School Suspension until the issue is resolved. A parent may be called to assist.

HHS School IDs

- **Student IDs must be worn at all times around the neck using the approved lanyard.**
- Students who arrive at school without their ID must go to the front office or to the specified locations in the HHS Commons to receive a new ID. Students will be charged \$5 for each replacement ID.

Phones and Earbuds/Headphones

- Due to each student being provided an individual Chromebook for the completion of learning and relevant assignments, the need for cell phone use during class is mitigated. Cell phones must be powered off.
- All students in possession of a cell phone and/or smartwatch will be required to turn it in at the beginning of each class to a designated storage area in the classroom. This area will be secured and monitored by the teacher, and will be out of student reach. Students will retrieve their devices individually at the end of class.
- Cell phone & smartwatch use is only permitted during non-instructional times, such as transitions between classes and at lunch. Use of cell phones and smartwatches in the hallways during instructional time is prohibited. If visible, items will be collected per the HHS cell phone and personal device policy.
- HHS will provide each teacher with a class set of earbuds to be used for instructional purposes only. **The use of earbuds or headphones is not to occur at any point during the school day (even at lunch), unless specifically instructed by the teacher.**
- **No personal technology (iPads, personal computers, etc.) is permitted on-campus during school hours and, if seen, will be treated the same as cell phones.**

Hall Passes

- To maximize teaching and learning throughout the school day, it is important that all students remain in class.
 - If a student must leave a class for any reason, she/he must have a teacher-provided pass.
- Students are encouraged to use the bathroom between classes and during lunch. If a student runs out of passes for the quarter, the teacher will allow the student to go to the restroom; however, a morning detention will be issued.
 - Students with medical issues who require frequent bathroom use should turn in the appropriate documentation to the school nurse so that a nurse's pass can be issued.
- If frequent hall pass issues persist, a parent/guardian conference with administration and a counselor will be held to discuss the issue and possible solutions.



- Administrators will be circulating around campus and will be verifying hall passes. Students without a valid hall pass will be escorted back to class.

Searches

- All members of the Tiger Family are expected to arrive at school with the appropriate focus necessary to succeed. **To ensure that distractions are minimized and the safety of everyone is protected, students, student belongings, and student vehicles parked on school campus may be subject to random searches by the HHS administration at any time.**

Student Parking

- The signed "HHS Parking Permit" agreement that all students and parents submit prior to being issued a parking permit will be strictly enforced. Please review the agreement with your son or daughter as it relates to the expectations of student drivers.
- **Students parking illegally on-campus will be booted.** A parental conference will be required prior to removing the boot. Appropriate school consequences will be applied.
- Students who repeatedly arrive late to school and are consistently tardy to 1st period will have their parking pass revoked.

Vapes/Electronic Cigarettes

- Underage vape use continues to be a nationwide epidemic. Please encourage your son or daughter to engage in wise and appropriate decision-making
- **Vape sensors have been installed in HHS bathrooms.**
- The use of vapes and electronic cigarettes on school grounds is strictly prohibited.
- Students found in violation will be required to attend a vape education program along with a suspension in ADAPT per the SCPPS Student Code of Conduct. Parental involvement may be required.

SCPPS Student Code of Conduct & Violence Prevention Program

- The SCPPS Student Code of Conduct and Violence Prevention Program is being updated for the 25-26 school year. As a reminder, students are expected to engage in productive and healthy habits that are conducive to success. As such, our focus remains on teaching and learning; engaging in physical altercations and using tobacco-related products are strictly prohibited on school grounds.
- In addition to vape deterrent programs (e.g. video campaigns, presentations, and other educational events), students found to be in possession of a vape device while on school grounds will be subject to the following:
 - **1st Vape Offense**
 - 3-day assignment to ADAPT; Vape Deterrent Education Intervention w/ Child Welfare and Attendance personnel.
 - **2nd Vape Offense**
 - 6-day assignment to ADAPT; Vape Deterrent Education Intervention w/ Child Welfare and Attendance personnel.
 - **3rd Vape Offense**
 - Recommendation for expulsion; Vape Deterrent Education Intervention w/ Child Welfare and Attendance personnel.



- A Violence Prevention Program is in place for all high schools to promote the physical and psychological safety of all students and adults. St. Charles Parish Public Schools has implemented a Violence Prevention Intervention Plan for high school students as follows:
 - **1st Offense - 45-day suspension (ADAPT) at Landry Educational Programs Center**
 - Mandatory Violence Prevention Intervention Program (VPP) participation
 - Academics
 - Restorative Intervention(s)
 - Counseling
 - SEL Lessons
 - Transportation Agreement required
 - **2nd Offense - Expulsion Recommendation**
- It is the responsibility of the parent to transport the student and meet with Landry administration on the first day of assignment to ADAPT at Landry Educational Programs Center. "Major" events, such as students not responding to adult intervention to end the physical aggression, or injury to a school employee, will result in an immediate expulsion recommendation and assignment to long-term ADAPT pending an expulsion hearing.
- **Any student who records or posts a video of a verbal or physical altercation will receive a 3-day assignment to ADAPT.**

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
