SCHOOL MISSION

Gilman School is a diverse community dedicated to educating boys in mind, body, and spirit through particular emphasis upon academic excellence, athletic participation, and aesthetic appreciation. Gilman seeks to produce men of character and integrity who have the skills and ability to make a positive contribution to the communities in which they live and work. Gilman School admits qualified applicants of any race, religion, color, sexual orientation, and national or ethnic origin.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- 4 years of English
- 3 years of Mathematics
- 3 years of World/Classic Language
- 2 years of Lab Science
- 3 years of History
- 4 years of Athletics
- 50 hours of community service
- 21 credits total required for graduation

In order to satisfy the State of Maryland graduation requirements, students must take a total of six credits of math and science combined.

Athletics are co-curricular within the Gilman program, and are considered the last class of the day. Students are required to participate in three seasons of interscholastic or intramural athletics. Seniors may opt out of one season.

UPPER SCHOOL CURRICULUM / GRADES 9-12

Gilman offers a highly rigorous college-preparatory curriculum. Students in the ninth and tenth grades take six courses each year. Juniors and seniors must take at least five courses each year.

Advanced Placement (AP) courses are offered in some disciplines. Students must receive departmental approval to enroll in an AP class. Due to scheduling constraints, it is not always possible to honor each student's request. *Departmental philosophy precludes offering an honors/AP track in English or history.*

English/History Honors Paper:

A one semester, ¼ credit course of independent study offered through the English and History Departments. Approved juniors and seniors, under the guidance of either the English or History Department, will compose a 15- to 20-page scholarly, critical essay. Final assessment includes an oral defense. Students receive a number grade.

TRI-SCHOOL COORDINATE PROGRAM

The Coordinate Program with neighboring Bryn Mawr and Roland Park Country Schools gives Gilman students access to about 200 courses across the three schools, including 40+ senior English electives. This collaborative program offers an expansive curriculum and the benefits of a co-educational learning environment.
