Charleston County School District Leaders Complete Institute for District Administrators (IDA) Leadership Program

Charleston, SC (September 11, 2025) - Stephanie Grayson, Director of Instructional Data Support; Andrea Mick, Assistant Director of Specialized Support Services; and Mary Stahl, Director of Secondary Exceptional Children Services and Supports, were selected to participate in Cohort 28 of the South Carolina Institute for District Administrators (IDA) Leadership Program and successfully completed the program on August 26, 2025.

This achievement reflects their strong commitment to advancing leadership excellence and enhancing support for students across Charleston County School District.

The South Carolina IDA, created by the state's Department of Education, emphasizes priorities such as personalization, collective leadership, and equity in access to effective instruction and leadership practices. The program spans four two-day sessions over seven months, incorporating strategies such as group discussions, seminars, simulations, 360° feedback, inquiry cycles, case studies, and networking.
