#### Independent Study & Dual Enrollment

CDS has dual enrollment agreements with surrounding colleges and universities, including Forsyth Technical Community College, Guilford Community College, Davidson-Davie Community College and Southeastern Bible College. Independent Study courses are available through Oaks Christian School, as well as the North Carolina Virtual Public System, per administrative approval.

#### Special Curriculum Notes

Striving to achieve excellence in academics, Calvary Day School offers a college preparatory cuuriculum through standard, honors, and Advanced Placement (AP) programs. CDS curriculum offers 88 courses in 8 subject areas, with advanced study opportunities. The CDS schedule allows students to take up to seven academic courses each year. In addition to core courses, students may select from a variety of elective courses to broaden their learning experience or to provide support to their core curriculum courses. Credits are awarded by the final grade.

AP COURSES: Generally not available to students until sophomore year. We limit 1 AP to sophomore year, and recommend balancing AP credits between junior and senior year. We do not limit, outside of the initial AP class allowed sophomore year. Students must be recommended to enroll in AP courses by their teachers based on grades in their semester prior, with a score of 90 or above from the prerequisite honors level class.
