What is Title I?

What is it?

How is it developed?

Wesley International Academy will take the following measures to promote and support parents as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our collective goals: We will:

Literacy and Numeracy Goals: By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, Wesley International Academy will increase math and reading proficiency by 3% as demonstrated on the Georgia Milestones. Additionally, Wesley will increase growth in our Economically Disadvantaged students by 5% as demonstrated on the Fall and Winter MAP scores. ***Whole Child Goals:*** By the end of the 2025-2026 school year, CCRPI attendance rate will increase by 3% in the subgroups of special education and economically disadvantaged students.
