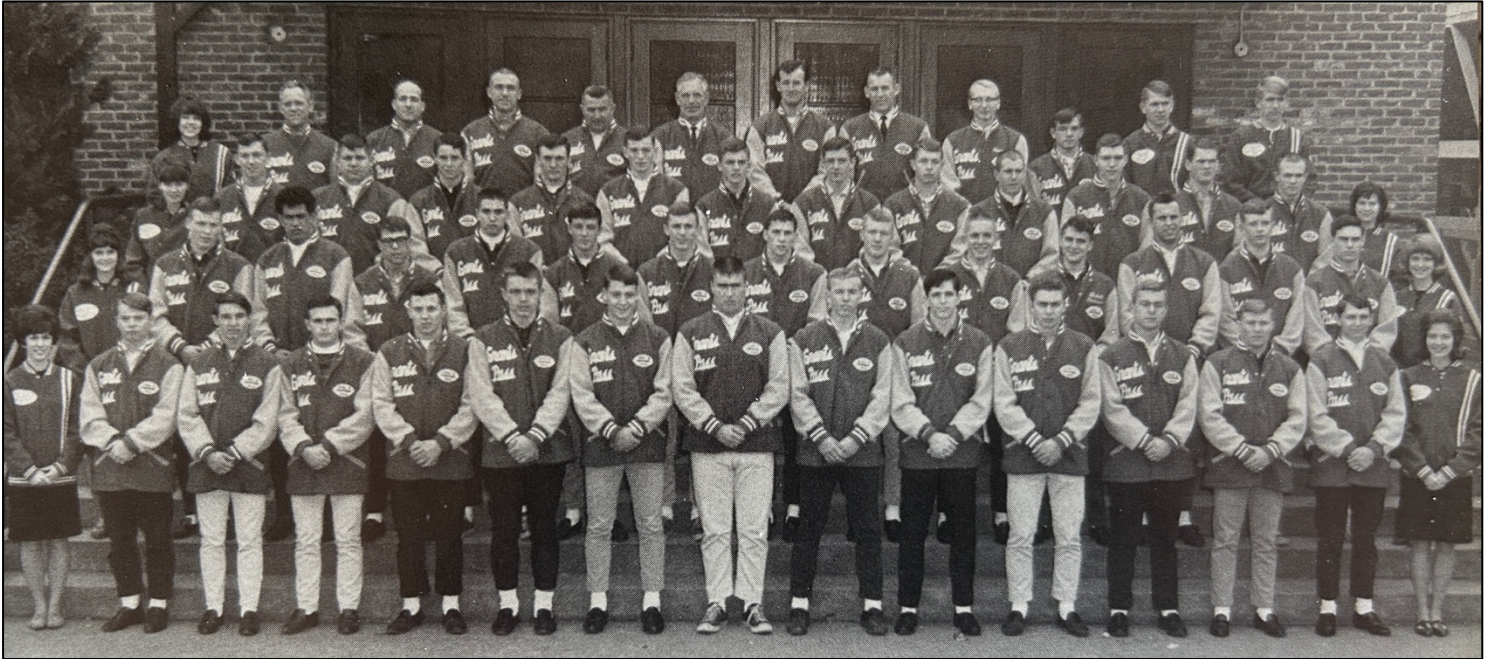

Beginning the season unranked with only 5 returning starters on defense and no returning starters on offense, little was expected from the 1964 Cavemen. But expectations grew each week as the gritty and unheralded Cavemen continued to win games, compiling a regular season record of 8-1. After a tie in the quarterfinal game with perennial power Roseburg, the Cavemen advanced to the semifinals by virtue of having more total yardage. Demolishing Grant HS of Portland 20-6 earned the Cavemen the opportunity to face the highly regarded Corvallis in the championship game.

Playing on a muddy field and in a driving rain storm, the Cavemen prevailed 7-0 earning the 3rd State Football Championship for Grants Pass High School.
