1. Narrative description of the Prop 28 arts education program(s) funded. (2500 character limit).

During the 2024–25 school year, California Military Institute (CMI) strategically utilized Proposition 28 funding to strengthen and expand access to arts and music education for students. Funding supported the addition of a certificated arts and music teacher, which enhanced course offerings and provided students with increased opportunities to participate in music and visual/performing arts. These programs are designed to develop creativity, discipline, and collaboration—skills that complement CMI’s college preparatory and leadership-focused mission.

Prop 28 resources were also used to purchase musical instruments, art supplies, and other instructional materials to ensure students have access to high-quality, standards-based arts instruction regardless of financial background. These investments created more equitable opportunities for cadets to engage in meaningful artistic expression, performance, and exhibition, while enriching the overall school climate and culture.

The expansion of arts and music programs at CMI directly supports PUHSD’s Strategic Plan and LCAP goals:
