GRADUATION ACADEMIC HONORS

At the end of the third marking period of the senior year, the students with the highest GPA and the next highest GPA are respectively named valedictorian and salutatorian. The following criteria will determine these awards:

- Completion of all credit requirements
- For the Class of 2026 and 2027, middle school courses with appropriate FLDOE course numbers count toward GPA
- For the Class of 2028 and later, middle school courses with appropriate FLDOE course numbers will appear on the transcript but will not count toward GPA
- Enrichment courses, Early Bird courses, and administratively approved Cava Virtual courses

The distinction of Summa cum Laude will be bestowed on students with a weighted GPA of 5.0 or higher, at the end of the third quarter grading period of the Senior year (7.5 semesters). GPA includes all courses taken at STA, Cava Virtual School, and FLVS. For students in the Class of 2026 and 2027, middle school courses with appropriate FLDOE numbers count toward GPA. For the Class of 2028 and after middle school courses with appropriate FLDOE numbers will appear on the STA transcript but will not factor into the STA GPA.
