District Overview: Thompson School District is the 17th largest school district in Colorado, encompassing 362 square miles and serving approximately 15,000 students. The district's territory includes Loveland and Berthoud, plus sections of Fort Collins, Windsor, Johnstown and unincorporated land in Larimer, Weld and Boulder counties. TSD serves students in Pre-K through 12th grade with thirteen school-based preschool programs, a dedicated preschool building, two K-8 buildings, eighteen elementary schools, five middle schools, five high schools, two charter schools and one career campus. Additionally, the district currently has a program dedicated to online learning. Teachers and administrators collaborate with families and community partners to ensure that students are college, career and community ready.

School Overview: There are approximately 1300 students enrolled at Loveland High School (LHS) in grades 9-12. As the original high school in the community, LHS was opened in 1894 and is a learning community committed to guiding students to become productive and involved citizens of the world. LHS offers a comprehensive curriculum for all students, including Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB) courses as well as opportunities to earn college credit through concurrent enrollment. All students are provided the opportunity to earn industry certifications through our Career Campus as well as various internship opportunities.

Community Overview: Loveland, a community of approximately 75,000, is nestled in a valley at the mouth of the beautiful Big Thompson Canyon and is known as the "Gateway to the Rockies". Residents have an appealing lifestyle from enjoying the great outdoors at our parks and lakes to taking in the culture of the arts. Located 50 miles north of Denver, the economic base is diverse with an employment range from professional to semi-skilled with a large representation in the skilled-technical careers. Tourism contributes to the economy in the summer months. Seven universities and two community colleges are within commuting distance. The three major universities located nearby are Colorado State University, the University of Colorado Boulder, and the University of Northern Colorado.

Student Achievement

- The number of AP exams administered in 2024-2025 was 431 with a total of 262 students testing.
- 77% of AP students received a score of 3 or higher in 2024-2025
- The number of IB exams in 2024-2025 was 47 with a total of 33 students registered.
- 36% of IB examinees scored a 4 or higher.
- Loveland High School had 59 AP Scholars from the 2024-2025 school year.
- Over 50% of students participate in one or more of the large variety of athletics and activities at our school.
- Loveland High School's visual and performing arts are widely acclaimed, each earning statewide recognition in 2024-2025.
- Student honors have included National Merit Finalists, Boettcher Foundation Scholars, and Daniels Scholars and appointments to various military academies.
