

Seattle Preparatory School – Senior Year Courses

In the 12th grade year, students are required to take a minimum of six classes each semester; students taking one AP class are required to take a minimum of six classes one semester and five classes the other semester; students taking two or more AP classes are required to take a minimum of five classes each semester. All students take a one-semester integrated course during the second semester called Senior Capstone, which count towards Theology credit. Students may continue with the next appropriate math course in the math sequence as well as science. All 12th grade students take a full year of English course(s).

Social Studies* (elective choice)	Students can choose one of the following: AP Economics: both Macro & Micro (year-long) AP Government and Politics (year-long) AP Psychology (year-long)	1.0 credit
Mathematics (elective choice)	Students typically continue along with the next appropriate course in the math sequence (click here).	1.0 credit (per course)
Science (elective choice)	Students typically elect to take one of the following: Anatomy & Physiology Physics AP Biology AP Environmental Science AP Physics C	1.0 credit (per course)
Theology* (required) *All students also enroll in a Senior Capstone course.	Students choose one semester-long course: Faith in Action Ignatian Themes in Film Pursuit of Happiness	1.0 credit
World Language (elective choice)	Students can continue with a level 4 World Language, if sufficient enrollment.	1.0 credit (per course)
Senior Capstone (required) *counts towards Theology credit.	Students are enrolled in a Senior Capstone second semester that combines Civics and Social Justice, which culminates in a final project.	0.5 credit
