The schedule for College Admission Officer Visits to WHS is linked [HERE](#). This schedule is updated as of September 10th. Students (grades 10-12) sign up for these visits, at least two days in advance, in SCOIR.

Juniors:

On October 21st, we will administer the PSAT/NMSQT at Wyoming High School. This practice test is optional for 11th grade students; however, it is the only qualifying test to be considered for the National Merit Scholarship Competition. The test will be administered at the high school starting at 8:00 a.m. Students choosing **not** to test will use this day to complete a separate educational option: college visit, service/volunteer opportunity, job shadowing, etc. We encourage students to use this day to gain exposure in a possible career field, learn more about a potential college or give back to their community. **It is important for students to know this is not a day off.**

Apply Now for Free and Reduced School Meals

Free and reduced meal applications are available online in the [Payschools Parent Portal](#). Additionally, paper applications are available in the school front offices. A new application is required each school year to determine eligibility for free or reduced meals; there is only a 30-day grace period from last school year's approval.

Instructional Fee Waiver: Prior to electronically signing and submitting the online application, please make sure to "check" the boxes in the disclosure section if you are also requesting an instructional fee waiver. This is an important step, as fees will not be waived without this authorization.

For families who are directly certified for free or reduced meals due to their eligibility through SNAP, TANF or Medicaid, you will receive a Direct Certification Notification from our Nutrition Services Partner, Milford Exempted Village Schools.

Please note that action is required - you must sign and return the Fee Waiver Permission on the bottom of that form - in order for instructional fees to be waived.

School Hearing & Vision Screenings Information (from Nurse Murphy):

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Starting in September, we will conduct vision and hearing screenings for all 9th and 11th grade students, as well as students new to the district, as required by Ohio law. If you choose not to have your child screened, please complete [this linked waiver](#) and return to your child's school.

You are encouraged to have your child's vision and hearing assessed by their health care provider if you choose to not have your child participate in the school screenings. [A vision and hearing form is linked here](#) for you to take to your child's appointment as you continue routine care for your child through pediatric well-child visits. We request a completed copy of these documents be sent to the school for our records.

Why is it important to have your child's vision screened?

Children with vision problems do not know the way that they see the world is not the way they should be seeing it! Without early detection and treatment, children's vision problems can lead to permanent vision loss and learning difficulties.

Why is it important to have your child's hearing screened?

- Hearing is important for speech, language development, reading and learning.
- A hearing screening can detect if your child needs further hearing testing.
- Even if your child has passed a hearing screening previously, their hearing can change.
- Hearing problems can be related to medical problems.
- Hearing loss is invisible and your child may appear to be not paying attention.

Attendance and District Calendar:

To report a student absence, a parent or guardian should send the dates and reason for the absence to whsattendance@wyomingcityschools.org or call 513-206-7062.

Non-Medical Absences:

- Every child is entitled to **five (5)** medical absences without a doctor's note; the parent simply needs to call or email.
- If a student arrives late or leaves early for an appointment, that day counts toward one of their **five (5)** excused (solely by a parent/guardian) absences unless a medical note is provided.

Medical Absences:

- Medical notes must be submitted within **five (5)** days to excuse an absence.
- A maximum of **five (5)** absences due to illness may be excused with a parent note each school year. Beginning with the **sixth (6th)** illness-related absence, a medical note is required for the absence to be excused.
- If a student arrives late or leaves early for an appointment, that day counts toward one of their **five (5)** excused (solely by a parent/guardian) absences unless a medical note is provided.

Below is a link to the school calendar so you know the days Wyoming City Schools are in session. Please make every effort to schedule trips, appointments, etc. outside of the school day. Instructional Fees:

At the beginning of each school year, instructional fees are assessed based on each student's grade level and/or course/class load. Fees are available to be paid online via the [Wyoming PaySchools portal](#) the first week of September. Wyoming City Schools strives for financial stewardship and wants to partner with families to ensure fees are paid in a timely manner. Fees are due by October 31st and school buildings will send fee reminders throughout the year. Instructional fee waivers are processed for those students who qualify for free lunch and complete the paperwork required for fee waivers. Applications for free lunch are available [here](#) through our nutrition services partner, Milford City Schools.

Implications for Non-Fee Payment

If a student is not up-to-date with payment of student fees (or is not current with their payment plan with the Treasurer), the following privileges will be withheld each year:

- 7-12 Dances (e.g. Homecoming, Prom, etc)
- 9-12 Class Shirts
- Junior/Senior Parking Spots
- Senior Class Trip (e.g. Washington D.C.)
- Graduation Tickets
- College Transcripts

For example, if a student, who has not paid their fees, goes to purchase a Homecoming ticket, PaySchools would not allow them to make the purchase.
