If you skip them, you won't know what will be assessed on quizzes and tests.

Turn In: To turn in your homework, everyone will need to upload a picture of their work to the corresponding Schoology assignment. You will need to take a picture of **all pages** with your iPad and upload them to Schoology.

Due Dates: Every assignment will be due the next day your class meets, at midnight. What if you miss the due date? I understand sometimes you won't have time after school to get all your homework done or you will have questions. I will still accept assignments up to the day of the test. This doesn't mean waiting till the night before the test to complete your homework that wouldn't benefit you. The sooner you turn in your homework, the sooner I can grade it and give you feedback. Feedback is what you need to improve your math skills and will help you be successful in class.

If you fall behind on homework, I will send emails home to make sure everyone is on the same page.

Additional Information

Grades: The time to work on improving your grade is during class throughout the quarter and semester. The last week of the quarter is not the time to come and ask how to fix your grade.
