CCSD Sets New District Record With 46 National Merit Scholarship Semifinalists for 2026

List includes 31 students from Academic Magnet

Charleston, SC (September 11, 2025) – Charleston County School District (CCSD) is proud to announce that a district record and state best 46 students from a combined five high schools are 2026 semifinalists in the National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC) for the 71st annual National Merit Scholarship Program. The previous district mark was set in 2020 with 42 NMSC semifinalists.

In addition, Academic Magnet High School leads the state with 31 semifinalists, setting a new school and district record.

"We are incredibly proud to celebrate the most National Merit Finalists in the history of CCSD," said Superintendent of Schools Anita Huggins. "This remarkable achievement reflects the extraordinary talent, determination, and perseverance of our students and the support of their families, teachers, and schools. These finalists embody the spirit of excellence that defines CCSD, and we are honored to recognize them as shining examples of what is possible when hard work and opportunity align."

Academic Magnet's previous high for National Merit Semifinalists was 29 in 2020, the same year the district set its previous record.

"Our entire AMHS faculty is so proud of these scholars who are already achieving at the most elite academic levels," explained Jacob Perlmutter, Academic Magnet's principal. "We can't wait to see their continued contributions to our world."



These 46 CCSD high school seniors will compete for 6,930 National Merit Scholarships worth nearly \$26 million, which will be awarded in the spring. About 95 percent of the semifinalists are expected to earn recognition as a finalist, and approximately half of the finalists will win a National Merit Scholarship.

High school juniors entered the 2026 National Merit Scholarship Program by taking the 2024 Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT), which served as an initial screen of program entrants. The nationwide pool of semifinalists, representing less than one percent of U.S. high school seniors, includes the highest-scoring entrants in each state. The number of semifinalists in a state is proportional to the state's percentage of the national total of graduating seniors.

To become a finalist, the semifinalist and a high school official must submit a detailed scholarship application including the student's academic record, participation in school and community activities, demonstrated leadership abilities, employment, and honors and awards. A semifinalist must have an outstanding academic record throughout high school, be endorsed and recommended by a high school official, write an essay, and earn SAT or ACT scores that confirm the student's earlier performance on the qualifying test.

2026 National Merit Scholarship winners will be announced in four nationwide news releases beginning in April and concluding in July. These scholarship recipients will join more than 389,000 other distinguished young people with the Merit Scholar title.
