Assistance in development of Culturally Relevant curriculum topics, and material for all grade levels.



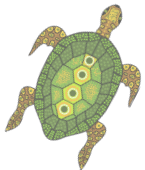

OUR HISTORY

Bismarck Public Schools Indigenous Education has served students well over 40 years, through the treaty obligation to provide educational support and resources through the Johnson O'Malley program, and Title VI. In the past, the work and implementation of the use of resources for our Indigenous Students fell on the shoulders of an identified principal in the district. This has now changed to include an Indigenous Education Director, four Cultural Responsive Coordinators, along with an Indigenous Education Curriculum Specialist. By growing our department and aligning the work to be most impactful while serving our Indigenous students, we have been able to collaborate with various partners and stake holders to best serve the needs of our Indigenous Students more directly and intentionally.

These groups are strengths-based, solution focused and student-centered. The groups are designed to promote inclusivity, celebration of culture and nurture our students' sense of belonging and identity.
