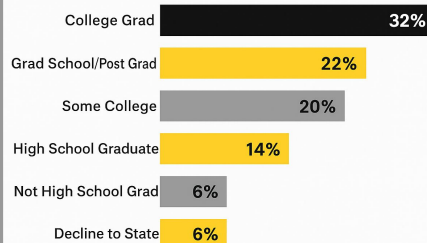

### Third Year of Math

Tustin Unified School District re-aligned their math course sequence and revised their curriculum for Algebra 2 and Algebra 2/Trig. Beginning with 23-24 school year, Alg. 2/Trig will be offered to all students in lieu of Algebra 2.

### RANKING

In accordance with Tustin Unified School District practice, Foothill High School does not rank students.

Foothill will provide percentile range rankings when requested by universities and scholarship organizations.

### Fall 2025 GRADING

Foothill High School utilizes a weighted four-point system to calculate students' grade point averages.  
 Grade Scale: 4.0=A+/A/A- 3.0=B+/B/B- 2.0=C+/C/C- 1.0=D+/D/D-

Advanced Placement/Honors courses are weighted  
 Grade Scale: 5.0=A+/A/A- 4.0=B+/B/B- 3.0=C+/C/C- 1.0=D+/D/D-

Students with international or unaccredited records will receive a "P" Pass or "F" Fail grade on their Foothill High School transcript. Students are encouraged to provide a copy of their original international records directly to colleges and universities for grade interpretation as warranted.

### Credit Recovery and Remediation

Students who earn a D or F in most courses are eligible to participate in our credit recovery/d-validation program (available for CP level courses only). When a student successfully completes a recovered course, the original course is "repeat tagged" on their transcript. This means that although the original course remains visible, it is excluded from both the student's credit total and grade point average (GPA) calculation.

## CCAP Dual Enrollment with Irvine Valley College

(CCAP - Community College Access Pathway)

FHS has developed a partnership with Irvine Valley College. Students have the option to augment their course loads with transferable college courses that are taught on our campus. Under this agreement with IVC, students can complete **Dance 77, Management 1, Entrepreneurship 200, 211 and 212, American Sign Language 21 and 22, Kinesiology 85** (eff. 23-24), **86** (eff. 25-26), **101** (eff. 25-26), and **212** (offered 23-24), and **Nutrition 2** (eff. 23-24) on the FHS campus while earning both high school and college credit. Up until 2022-2023, **Communications 1 and 3** were also available. 132 of our juniors and seniors (approx 12%) take an IVC CCAP class.

## HONORS, ADVANCED PLACEMENT, and INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE CLASSES

Although grades and teacher recommendation are used for primary placement, students have the option to request enrollment in Honors, AP, or IB courses.

## SPECIAL PROGRAMS

### IB Program

The International Diploma Program is a rigorous, world-renowned college preparatory program that provides a challenging, internationally focused, broad and balanced educational experience for students aged 16 to 19. The program is designed to equip students with the academic skills needed for university study, further education and their chosen profession. Additionally, the program supports the development of the values and life skills needed to live a fulfilled and purposeful life. Foothill currently has 50 IB students (juniors and seniors) and over 200 students in pre-IB courses (freshmen and sophomores).

**Over the past two years, Foothill's IB Diploma pass rate is 97%.**

### AVID

Advancement Via Individual Determination is a structured and rigorous college preparatory program for self-motivated, potential college-bound students that serves over 200 Foothill students across grades 9-12. Nationally, AVID graduates who go to college are four times more likely to graduate than their national peers, 93% of AVID students complete four-year college entrance requirements and 95% gained acceptance into 4-year colleges & universities. Of the 44 students in the Foothill AVID class of 2025, **100% gained acceptances into 4-year colleges & universities and 98% matriculated into college.**

### CTE PATHWAYS FHS CTE Webpage

Career Technical Education pathways are electives where students progress in a technical skill earning a cord at graduation for pathway completion. CTE pathways include engineering, manufacturing, computer science, visual imagery (photography), culinary arts, media arts (film & television), graphic design, robotics, and applied medical.

**38% of the Class of 2025 received at least one CTE Pathway Cord.**
