## Upper School Overview

Packer's Upper School faculty, over 88% of whom hold advanced degrees, are dedicated to helping students to develop strengths and interests in academic, artistic, and athletic pursuits, as well as to grow through leadership and service. Our program offers interdisciplinary and project-based learning, the integration of technology, the opportunity for study beyond the walls of the school, and a balance between core academic requirements and student-selected areas of study. Packer's Upper School provides a learning environment that supports students in developing as individuals as well as members of a community. This approach fosters their development as critical thinkers, compassionate citizens, and engaged learners who understand the connection between what is learned in the classroom and lived in the world.

## Community

Our commitment to the diversity of the people in our community encompasses every social identifier, and regarding race specifically, our student body consists of 45% students of color. Upper School students commute from all parts of Brooklyn and Manhattan, and smaller numbers come from as far away as the Bronx, Long Island, and New Jersey. In 2024-25, 28% of our students received financial aid. Our community is strengthened by the inclusion of students from Prep for Prep, Oliver Scholars, TEAK Fellowship, and other educational-access programs.

# Features of Packer's Upper School



## English Scholars Program

Packer offers a new two-year program that runs through both the junior and senior year; members from the Class of 2026 will be the first cohort to reflect this distinction. English Scholars are selected through a rigorous application process and have demonstrated consistent high achievement in all English classes. Students will complete additional coursework in English in junior and senior year. Additionally, a highlight of this program is that Scholars write a 10-12 page research paper on a topic that is inspired by past or current coursework or by a personal area of interest. At the end of junior year, they will defend the paper's argument to an academic panel which includes the English Department.

## Classics Scholars Program

The Classics Scholars Program requires enrollment in four years of Upper School Latin, consistent high achievement in all Latin classes, and additional coursework in an approved Classics-related elective in English or History. Finally, it requires an independent pursuit culminating in a written project and oral defense by the end of the senior year.

## Independent Science Research Program

Packer offers a three-year sequence of study in the physical and life sciences, leading to two school years and two summers of laboratory research with professional scientists. Students in this program have received national recognition as well as credited publication in prominent scientific journals. Some may also receive college credit through the SUNY system.



## Journalism Program

There is a competitive selection process for students to participate in Packer's three-year Journalism program. It is a rigorous academic course with an emphasis on writing and research, in which students participate in Columbia's Scholastic Press Association annual conference, engage with award-winning journalists (both in and outside of the classroom), and mentor other developing journalists at Packer.

## The Packer Symposium

A two week mini-term between semesters, the Packer Symposium program is a highlight of the Upper School curriculum. The array of unique courses designed by our faculty members extends our community's development beyond the traditional classroom and constructs a rich, meaningful, experience-based educational opportunity that encourages both intellectual development and social-emotional growth. All juniors travel to participate in our International Symposium, which ensures that every Packer graduate gains experience using their collaborative and problem-solving skills to generate ideas in unfamiliar contexts, working with people who may not share a common language.



## Independent Study and Senior Thesis

Students personalize and deepen their individual interests while working one-on-one with a selected faculty mentor. In the independent study, students build a portfolio of their self-directed exploration, which culminates in a presentation. In the senior thesis, students research and create an intensive, semester-long capstone project and present their work as a final step.

## Peer Support

Students are identified and trained through a highly selective process to become mentors to younger students in our Peer Support program. They meet weekly with adult facilitators to strengthen leadership and facilitation skills, offering informal counseling, tutoring, and mindfulness support to younger peers.

## Global Learning

Through our mission-driven Global Learning and Community Engagement programs, students are empowered to apply their collaborative and problem-solving skills in real-world contexts, working toward sustainable solutions in partnership with communities.
