Scholarships: What to Expect

- Scholarships are usually based on GPA, test scores (SAT/ACT), community service, or your career interests.
- The stronger your **resume** (grades, activities, leadership, service), the more options you'll have.
- Scholarships are **competitive** apply to as many as you can and put effort into every application.

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) opens the door to:

- Federal aid (grants, loans, work-study)
- State of Indiana aid
- Many college-specific scholarships
- File online at studentaid.gov. It's always FREE!

Important Dates

- Opens: October 1 every yearIndiana state deadline: April 15
- Federal deadline: June 30 (but apply early—money can run out!)

Tip: Even if you think you won't qualify, still file. Many scholarships require a completed FAFSA.
