

What do I need for class?



How is my grade calculated?



A	90 — 100%
B	80 — 89%
C	70 — 79%
D	60 — 69%
F	0 — 59%

Grades will be **weighted by category**. This means that some points are worth more than others based on what type of work it is. For example, tests are worth more than quizzes. Below is an example of weighted grades versus unweighted (total points) grades:

	Homework	Quizzes	Unit Tests	Final Grade
Unweighted:	95/100	+ 75/100	+ 70/100	$240/300 = .80 = 80\% B$
Weighted:	$.10(95/100)$	+ $.20(75/100)$	+ $.70(70/100)$	$0.095 + 0.15 + .049 = .735 = 73.5\% C$
