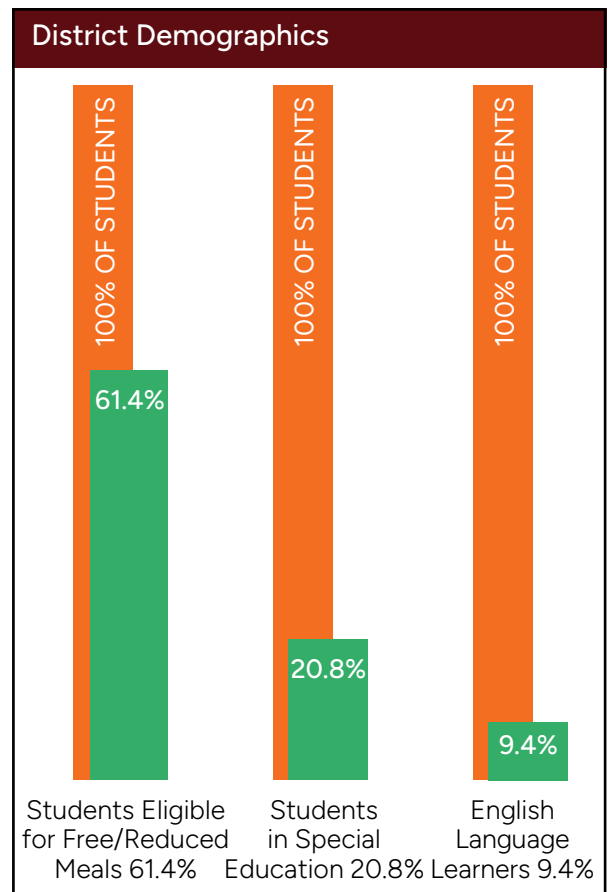
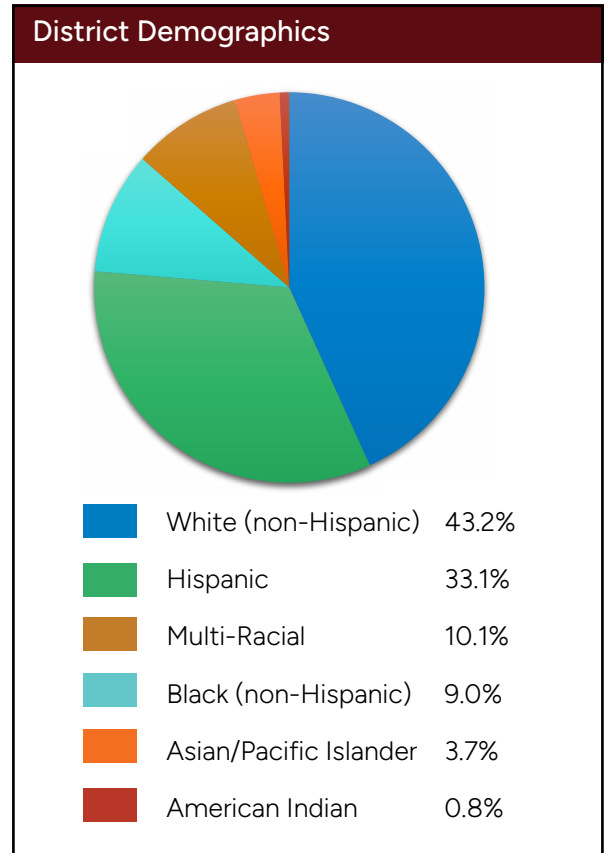
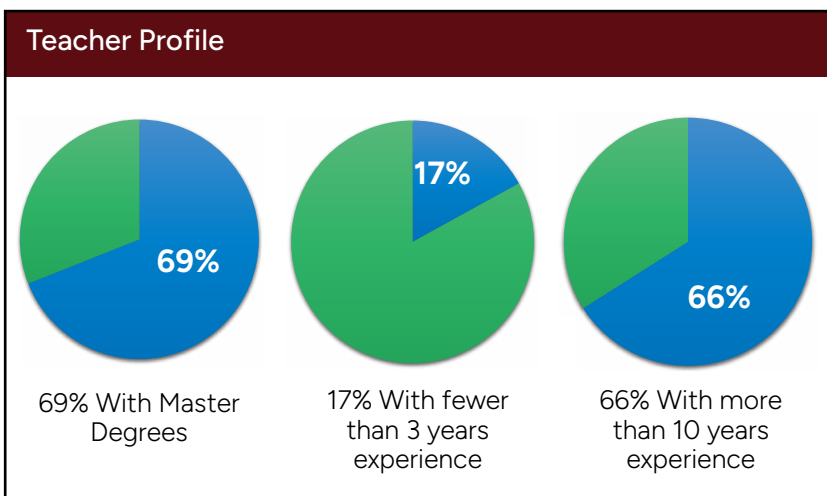

Early Learning

- Promotes healthy growth and development in children
- Provides families with child development resources
- Lays the foundation for academic, emotional, and social success

Elementary

- Teaches fundamental academic subjects that form the foundation of a student's educational journey
- Offers specialist classes for K-5 including science, media arts, visual arts, physical education, and music
- Safe and supportive learning environment

Middle School

- Builds on fundamental academic subjects
- Targeted support to help students build skills and provide enrichment at a more individualized level
- Class offerings for students to explore interests and career paths

High School

- Academic planning and counseling to assist students in navigating their educational path at SSPPS
- Provides students with tools, resources, and individualized college and career advising
- Concurrent enrollment courses for students seeking college-level experience/credits while still enrolled in high school
- Career and Technical Education for students looking to enter the workforce after graduation
- TriDistrict Centers for Advanced Professional Students (CAPS) collaboration creates opportunities for students to explore different careers and learn about ways to earn college credits, degrees, job-ready certifications, and internships while in high school
- IB Diploma Program a more rigorous academics studies, further preparing grade 11 and 12 students for post-secondary options
- Building Assets, Reducing Risks (BARR) allows staff to better understand and proactively address non-academic reasons why a student may be falling behind

ADDITIONAL DISTRICT HIGHLIGHTS

Talent Development and Advanced Academics

The K-5 Talent Development Program provides equitable access in developing talents in students of all abilities, races, ethnicities, languages, gender, and socioeconomic circumstances.

Program Priorities

- Identifying and nurturing strengths and interests for all students
- Ensuring all students have the opportunity to enhance their critical thinking skills and develop high level educational routines
- Respecting students knowledge and empowering them to actively engage in their academic pathway
- Elevating the depth, complexity and acceleration to students who need advanced instruction
- Providing supplementary enrichment opportunities for support and success

Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS)

Our academic and student support team in each school includes teachers and educational support assistants, mental health professionals (counselors, psychologists, and social workers), and instructional leaders (administrators and instructional coaches). This team works collaboratively to provide high-quality instruction and intervention support to match each student's needs. The framework for MTSS in SSPPS includes:

- Tier 1: Academic and behavioral support with differentiated instruction for all students in a general education setting
- Tier 2: Targeted supplemental instruction and intervention
- Tier 3: Intensive individualized instruction and intervention
