STILLWATER AREA HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The Board of Education requires a minimum of 43 credits in grades 9-12. Required classes include eight credits each in language arts and social studies, six credits each in mathematics and science, one credit each in health and physical education and two credits in fine arts. EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Stillwater Area High School students can participate in 36 MSHSL activities, 10 fine arts groups, 9 independent providers and 24 student clubs including debate, music, student government, National Honor Society, theater and other clubs. NOTEABLE HIGHLIGHTS

- State and national awards for student publications for the *Kabekonian* (our yearbook) and the *Pony Express* (our student newspaper). The Pony Express just earned its 20th International First Place Award from the Quill and Scroll. Our print and online publications consistently rank All-State Gold from Journalism Education Association. Our Publications earned 3rd place in state from the Minnesota High Scholastic Press Association. We also had 9 students earn individual awards at the state and national level from Best of SNO and the Journalism Education Association.
- Longest streak of superior ratings in the Minnesota State High School League in musical competitions involving the bands (Concert, Varsity, Symphonic), the orchestras (Concert, Varsity, Symphonic and Chamber) and the choirs (The Stillwater Choir, Varsity Men, Varsity Women, Belle Chanter, Vagabonds, Select Women and Sophomore Chamber Choir). Recognized nationally as one of the premier high schools for music education and performing ensembles, the choirs, bands and orchestras at Stillwater Area High School have on multiple occasions been selected through blind auditions to perform at state and regional conventions as well as top college festivals.
- Repeated recognition from the AP College Board in the 2024-25 school year in which 119 students were named AP Scholars, 50 students were named AP Scholars with Honors, 74 students were named AP Scholars with Distinction.
- Stillwater has had 64 Minnesota State High School League State team athletic championships, including adapted sports. In 2024-25 SAHS had 9 conference championships and 7 section titles.

GRADING SYSTEM

Stillwater Area High School has a decile ranking system and 4.0 grading scale. Academic letters are awarded to students who earn a GPA of 3.750 or above for the previous full academic year and *Prior to Fall of 2025 there was a weighted ranking system for grading in all of our Advanced Placement (AP), College in the Schools (CIS), Concurrent Enrollment (CE), Project Lead The Way (PLTW), and Post-Secondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) courses.
