Child Nutrition Department Charge Policy 2025-2026

Sanger ISD Child Nutrition Department makes it a priority to ensure all students have access to nutritious meals daily. Students have the ability to charge the reimbursable meal to their account if they do not have the funds to pay for the reimbursable meal at the time of service. It is the responsibility of the parents to manage their students accounts and pay off debts within a timely manner.

Students may charge 5 breakfasts and 5 lunches, totaling \$26.75 for primary students and \$27.75 for secondary students at the full pay price. The Child Nutrition Department will make a focused effort to communicate with families to collect the debt before reaching the cap. Students who have reached the charge limit will not be allowed to purchase ala carte items until the account is below the cap.

Payments can be made by sending cash or check with your student. Payments may also be made online utilizing School Cafe, which also allows families to monitor their students account. Guardians are encouraged to download app.

Charging is not permitted for snacks and extras.
