SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

The City of Rye is located in southern Westchester County, New York, 26 miles northeast of New York City, with a population of 15,000 residents. Excellence in education is a top priority for the community, and expenditure per pupil for the 2023–2024 school year was \$35,735.

Rye High School is a four-year comprehensive public high school with a population of 882 students, a teaching staff of 106, and accreditation from the New York State Department of Education.

Central to Rye High School's identity is the **Rye Commitment**: to be respectful, responsible, and engaged. These values guide students in developing collaboration, integrity, and resilience while also fostering critical thinking, problem-solving, and other essential 21st-century skills. Together, they prepare students for success in college and careers, and for meaningful contributions as innovative, compassionate leaders in a global society.


In alignment with **The Rye Commitment**, Rye High School fosters a rigorous and supportive academic environment that prepares students for college and beyond. Students can pursue a broad range of **Advanced Placement (AP)** courses as well as the **International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme**, which emphasizes critical thinking, research, and global perspectives. **The Academy at Rye High School** offers a selective, two-year interdisciplinary program for juniors and seniors centered on project-based learning and community action research.

In partnership with **Syracuse University Project Advance (SUPA)** and **St. John's College Advantage**, Rye students may also earn dual-enrollment credit through college-level courses. Specialized opportunities further enrich learning, including **Project Lead the Way (PLTW)** for aspiring engineers, Science Research for original, mentored investigations, and **concentrations in the Arts, Engineering & Computer Science**, and Career & Technical Education through **Southern Westchester BOCES**.

GRADING SYSTEM

Rye High School does not academically rank students. Of the 219 students enrolled in the Class of 2026, 215 have been included in grade distributions. The remaining students have not been included because they transferred into the school for the 2025-2026 school year.

1. A cumulative grade point average (GPA) for each student is calculated using all graded, credit-bearing courses taken at Rye High School based on six semesters of study, including high school courses taken during middle school.
2. Honors and AP courses are weighted. An additional 5 points are added to the final average of each course when computing the GPA. The weighted GPA is recorded on the bottom right of the transcript.
3. Core academic courses at Rye High School are taught on several levels of difficulty. Courses are designated H (Honors), R (Regents preparation), AP for Advanced Placement courses, and IB for International Baccalaureate courses.
4. Courses taken outside the high school structure (summer enrichment programs, university programs, etc.) are not calculated in the grading.
