



School, Parent, and Family Engagement Policy

PART I. GENERAL EXPECTATIONS

BUCKEYE HIGH SCHOOL agrees to implement the following statutory requirements:


1. Buckeye High School will take the following actions to involve parents in the joint development of its school parental involvement plan under section 1118 of the ESEA:
 - a. Send notification that BHS is a Title I school, notifying parents that they can be involved providing input into the creation of the Title I SWP.
 - b. Inform parents of meeting to develop school compact, informing parents of opportunities to interact on behalf of their student.
 - c. Post school compact and SWP to allow parents to provide input and opportunities to interact on behalf of their student.
2. BHS will take the following actions to involve parents in the process of school review and improvement under section 1116 of the ESEA:
 - a. Notify parents of all SWP meetings.
 - b. SWP will be updated quarterly on the school website for review.
 - c. Include parents on the SWP committee.
3. BHS will hold an annual meeting to inform parents of the school's participation in Title I, Part A programs, and to explain the Title I, Part A requirements and the right of parents to be involved in Title I, Part A programs. The school will convene the meeting at a time convenient for parents and will offer a flexible number of additional parental involvement meetings, such as in the morning or evening, so that as many parents as possible are able to attend. - c. Students will be provided the information given out at the meetings.
4. BHS will provide parents of participating children information in a timely manner about Title I, Part A programs that includes a description and explanation of the school's curriculum, the forms of academic assessment used to measure children's progress, and the proficiency levels students are expected to meet by:
 - a. Orientation meeting at the beginning of the school year to describe and explain curriculum, forms of assessment, and the proficiency levels students are expected to make
 - b. Regular contact with parents in on-going follow-up of assessments and graded assignments available through parent portal and Remind messaging app.
5. BHS will, at the request of parents, provide opportunities for regular meetings for parents to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions about the education of their children. The school will respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicably possible by:
 - a. Scheduled parent teacher conferences
 - b. Email correspondence
 - c. Requests for PTC set up
6. BHS will provide each parent an individual student report about the performance of their child on the State assessment in at least math, language arts and reading by:
 - a. Copy of assessment results sent home
 - b. Results of diagnostic and/or benchmarks shared home
 - c. Teachers discuss student progress toward assessments in PTC
7. BHS will take the following actions to provide each parent timely notice when their child has been assigned or has been taught for four (4) or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not certified in the area which he/she teaches by:
 - a. Parents' Right to Know sent home with students
 - b. Specific teacher Parents' Right to Know sent home with students
8. BHS will provide assistance to parents of children served by the school, as appropriate, in understanding topics by undertaking the actions described in this paragraph –
 - the state's academic content standards,
 - the state's student academic achievement standards,
 - the state and local academic assessments including alternate assessments,
 - the requirements of Part A,
 - how to monitor their child's progress, and
 - how to work with educators:
9. List of activities, such as workshops, conferences, classes, both in-state and out-of-state, including any equipment or other materials that are necessary to ensure success.
 - a. The school will have a parent meeting to discuss Title I, what it is and how it will serve the students of Buckeye High School. Parents will be given information on how to work with educators at this meeting.
 - b. Information will be shared with parents on ways to monitor their child's progress during the academic school year.
10. BHS will provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their children's academic achievement, such as literacy training and using technology, as appropriate, to foster parental involvement, by:
 - a. FAFSA nights
 - b. Parent Nights
 - c. Title I Meetings
 - d. Links to material provided by state/district
11.
