Who do I contact at E.C.S?

Parents and guardians often wonder where to turn if they have a question or concern regarding their child or other school issues. Use this guide to help you navigate through our District to find the quickest way to resolve your issue. This chain of communication will help us be the most responsive to your need and ensures the appropriate personnel are helping with a resolution.



WHERE TO START? Use this guide when you have an issue or question to resolve:

1 Classroom Problem?

Start with your child's teacher. They are in the best position to address classroom-related issues and know your child and family best. If the problem is beyond the teacher's area of expertise or control, the teacher will refer you to the school counselor or correct staff member.

- Not able to resolve your problem with the teacher?

 Next, try the assistant principals, who will usually be able to resolve your problem. You can call or email the assistant principals directly. A listing of all administration is on our school website.
- 3 Not able to resolve your problem with an asst. principal?

 Try the appropriate administrative department that is applicable to your issue. The assistant principal can guide you in the right direction.
- 4 Problem not resolved through the above channels? Contact the principal/ superintendent. You can call or email directly.







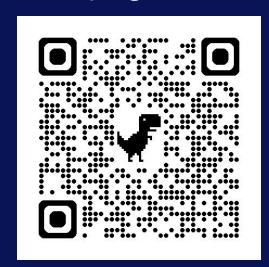

District H.I.B Website and Policies

Conflict vs. Harassment, Intimidation, & Bullying (H.I.B.)

- **Conflict** is two sided:
 - A mutually competitive or opposing action or engagement, including a disagreement, an argument, or a fight where both sides are actively involved.
- Bullying is one-sided:
 - One or more students are victims of one or more person's aggression,
 which is intended to physically or emotionally hurt the victim(s).
- Bullying is unwanted, aggressive behavior that may involve a <u>real or perceived</u> <u>characteristic</u> and there is a <u>power imbalance</u>.
 - Race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, gender identity, and expression or a mental, physical or sensory disability, or by any other distinguishing characteristics,
 - The aggressor knows or should have known that the behavior was likely to cause harm.
 - Takes place on school property, school sponsored function, a school bus, or off school grounds
 - Substantially disrupts or interferes with the orderly operation of the school or infringes on the rights of the student(s).

Reporting Procedure and Timeline

Reporting Requirements (N.J.S.A. 18A:37-15)

- Any person hired by the Board of Education or volunteer who witnesses or receives reliable information about a possible act of HIB must verbally report it to the principal or designee on the <u>same day</u>.
- A written report must be submitted to the principal or designee within <u>2</u> school days of the verbal report.

Initial Determination

- The principal or designee in collaboration with ABS must determine if the allegation meets the statutory definition of HIB.
 - If it meets criteria → an investigation is initiated within 1 school day of the written report.
 - If it does not meet criteria → the matter may be addressed under the school's Code of Conduct.

Investigation Process and Forms

Investigation Process

- The Anti-Bullying Specialist (ABS) leads the investigation.
- The investigation must be completed within 10 school days of the written report.
- Results are reported to:
 - 1. Superintendent
 - 2. The Board of Education reviews cases at their next meeting.
 - i. Parents are notified of the outcome and may appeal after that meeting.

<u>Student Reporting-</u> Students are permitted (and encouraged) to report suspected HIB but are not legally required to meet the "same day" reporting standard.

ESEA Grant
