ATTENDANCE POLICY FOR BHCS


Ben Hill County School District has begun a new Attendance Protocol. This protocol is to align our district with the new Senate Bill 123 (SB 123) that was signed by Governor Brian P. Kemp on April 28, 2025. This bill states that public schools are prohibited from expelling students solely due to absenteeism, promoting a more supportive approach to attendance issues. A student is considered "chronically absent" if they miss 10% or more of the school year. School systems with a chronic absenteeism rate of at least 10% or individual schools with rates at or above 15% are required to establish attendance review teams. The 10% is excused and unexcused absences, so our aim is to monitor ALL absences.

Ben Hill County School District in conjunction with the Department of Education has reviewed our attendance data from the past few years. With that data and a committee assigned by Judge Pack, Juvenile Justice Judge, and other organizations and our schools, the protocol began in our county. This protocol is to lay out specific attendance protocols on how and when we address absenteeism with our students. Ben Hill County School District has begun sending out letters that state when a child in our system is out 3, 5, or 6 days excused and unexcused. This alerts our system and our parents that their child is missing these days and to make sure to notify our schools with excuses from a physician or parent written note.

School attendance is a high priority for student success. Our hope is to reduce the number of unexcused absences, increase the percentage of students present for state-mandated testing, improve school climate in each school, and reduce the number of students who are chronically absent.

As a system, we are here to help you, the parent or guardian, any way we can to make sure that your child is at school and has the keys for academic success. If your child has to be absent from school, please notify the teacher through Class Dojo, phone call or note to the school so that we can make sure to document that in our system.

Our protocol is attached. Please review this protocol and make sure to communicate effectively with our schools. We only want the very best for you and your child. Your child's attendance, success, and safety are our top priorities. Thank you for your support and cooperation. Go Canes!

BHES: HAMMOND'S CLASS ~ CLIMATE/WEATHER

Mrs. Brittany Hammond's 4th grade class learned about climate and weather this past week. They discussed the different tools that can be used to measure different types of weather, and to finish out the lesson they created working rain gauges to measure rainfall. They used an old bottle to create the gauge and used a ruler to mark increments in inches on the gauge. They were also able to decorate their rain gauges.

The students were so excited about this lesson they are even hoping for rain this weekend so they can test their tools out. What a great hands-on activity for learning!

Students in Ms. Bowden and Ms. Byrd's biology classes worked with a partner to construct a chain of Taylor Swift-style beads using instructions from a DNA code. They transcribed DNA into mRNA and then translated the message into instructions for assembling the "friendship bracelet" bead chain. They learned that when DNA is replicated, sometimes random mutations occur.
