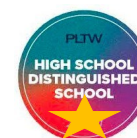

### THE COMMUNITY

The Victor Central School District draws its **4,274** students from the towns of Victor, Farmington, Macedon, Bloomfield and Perinton. There are **1,319** students in the high school, **26.23%** of whom receive free or reduced lunch. The high school has **153** full and part time staff. The towns are primarily residential suburbs of Rochester. The towns of Victor and Farmington are among the fastest growing suburban communities in New York State.

### CURRICULUM SUMMARY

Victor High School offers a strong college preparatory curriculum with about **82%** of Victor graduates in the class of 2024 continuing on to post-secondary education and training. Victor offers **112** courses in an 85 minute block schedule. All full year courses meet every other day, with the exception of Regents and Advanced Placement science courses, which meet three blocks in each four-day rotation. All half-credit courses meet two blocks in a four-day rotation for one semester, except Physical Education, which meets one block in a four-day rotation for the full year. Our Finger Lakes Technical & Career Center offers Career and Technology Education programs for juniors and seniors which meet two blocks daily off campus.

### GRADING SYSTEM

Grading is numerical, unweighted and unranked, with a passing average of 65%. Students are typically enrolled in a minimum of 6.5 credits each school year in grades 9-11, and a minimum of 5.5 credits in grade 12. We encourage your holistic review of the student's transcript and



### ELECTIVE PROGRAMS



#### **Advanced Placement (AP) Program**

The AP Program allows students to enroll in more challenging courses that may result in a college credit awarded based upon the AP Exam score earned, the student's major at college, and the AP policy at that college, as indicated on the college website. Victor offers **23** AP exams, including AP Language & Composition and AP English Literature; AP Calculus AB and BC; AP Pre Calc, AP Art 3D, AP Computer Science, AP Statistics; AP Biology, AP Chemistry, AP Environmental Science, AP Physics 1 and C; AP World and AP US History; AP Economics, AP Government, and AP Psychology; and AP Art. There are no restrictions on the number of AP courses students may take.

#### **Global Competence Certificate (GCC)**

The GCC program is designed to foster success in a global world. Students must complete at least 12 different experiences from the GC Certificate Approved Experiences list. Students must maintain a portfolio of documentation detailing evidence of completion.

#### **SUNY/Monroe Community College Dual Enrollment Program**

Victor High School has partnered with SUNY/MCC to offer "Personal Investing in the Stock Market" and "Intro to Optics" as dual enrollment courses, taught by Victor High School faculty who have been approved by SUNY/MCC to teach the courses on our VCS campus. These courses are offered to students in Grades 10, 11 and 12. Students enroll through MCC to have their final grade posted to a SUNY/MCC transcript.

#### **RIT "Project Lead the Way" (PLTW) Program**

Victor has been honored as a "PLTW Distinguished High School" the past three years for increasing student access, engagement and achievement in our PLTW program. This nationally recognized, dual enrollment Pre-Engineering Program for students in grades 9-12 is offered through an agreement with Rochester Institute of Technology (RIT). We offer six PLTW courses designed to promote problem-solving and critical thinking skills: Design & Drawing for Development, Principles of Engineering, Digital Electronics, Computer Integrated Manufacturing Systems, Civil Engineering & Architecture, and Engineering Design & Development. Students who achieve a class average of 85% or higher are administered the RIT exam for that course, and may choose to enroll through RIT to have their final grades posted to an RIT transcript.

#### **SUNY/Finger Lakes Community College "Gemini" Dual Enrollment Program**

SUNY/FLCC offers dual enrollment "Gemini" courses, taught by our Victor High School Faculty who have been approved by SUNY/FLCC to teach these courses on our campus. The following are offered to students in grades 10, 11 and 12: AP US History, AP Government, AP Economics, AP Psychology, World War I & World War II, AP Biology, French 4 & 5, Spanish 4 & 5, Pre-Calculus (Gr 12 only), Intro to Business, Personal Money Management, AP Language & Composition, Accounting, Computer Applications 1, Public Speaking and Leadership. Students enroll through FLCC to have their final grade posted to a SUNY/FLCC transcript.

**Scholastic Distinctions:**

In its 2025 ranking, *US News & World Report* ranked Victor Senior High School the 131st best school in New York State out of 1,276 NYS high schools (top 10%) and the 1,396th best school nationally out of 17,655 public high schools nationwide (top 7%). Locally, Victor Senior High School was ranked 5th out of 73 Rochester, NY metro area high schools (top 8%).

Niche.com 2025 rankings make Victor Central Schools a top school district in a variety of categories: Best High Schools for STEM in NY—#192 of 596; Best Public High Schools in New York—#134 of 1,283; and Best Public High Schools in the Rochester area—#6 of 56.

**AP Scholars:**

238 students were designated as AP Scholars based on their exceptional achievement on the May 2025 AP examinations. Of the 238 scholars, 129 are members of class of 2025, 87 are members of the class of 2026 and 22 are members of the class of 2027.

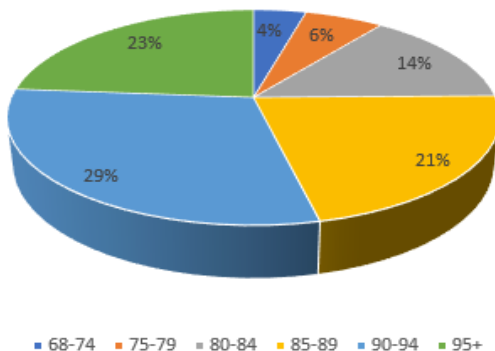
