ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Kingsway Regional School District has Six (6) Programs of Study that are tied to elective offerings that assist all students in the identification of their future college and career goals. The district also holds partnerships with local colleges that allow students to earn college credits while in high school through multiple avenues.
