COMMUNITY AND SCHOOLS

Clarkstown Central School District is located in a largely residential suburban community in Rockland County, 25 miles from New York City. There are two high schools (North and South) comprised of grades 9-12. Both high schools have been accredited by the New York State Department of Education and the Tri-State Consortium. The district's reputation and commitment to academic excellence has been noted since its establishment in 1949.

FACULTY AND SERVICES

North High School is staffed by a principal, three assistant principals, school counselors, psychologists, student assistance counselors, nurses, speech therapists, school resource officers and librarians. In addition to the regular classroom staff, the district provides a full range of special educational services from academic assistance and resource rooms to self-contained programs.

GRADING SYSTEM

Clarkstown uses a numeric grading system, (0-100%), in which 65.00 is the lowest passing grade. GPA is based on all completed high school courses. Only Honors, IB & AP classes are weighted. **Final Course grades appearing on the transcript are unweighted; only the cumulative GPA is weighted.**

CURRICULUM

The Clarkstown Central School District has a longstanding dedication to offering educational experiences that cater to the individual learning interests of our students. With a diverse array of course offerings, Clarkstown is committed to maintaining a rigorous high school curriculum and upholding high standards for ALL students. Our programs are designed to address the varied needs of our students while focusing on preparing them for the future.

We encourage all students to consider enrolling in one or more college-level courses during their high school years. College-level opportunities at Clarkstown include Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB), and Dual Enrollment courses. Our Dual Enrollment courses are offered in partnership with institutions such as Syracuse University Project Advance, Marist College, Seton Hall University, SUNY Albany, SUNY Cobleskill, St. Thomas Aquinas College, and Dominican University.

Students are recommended by their teachers for Honors, Dual Enrollment, AP and IB courses. Students, via their parents, can apply to waive into a higher-level course provided that the student meets the sequential prerequisites of the course.

CORE CURRICULUM HIGHLIGHTS

SPECIAL PROGRAMS OF STUDY

IB Diploma: The IB Diploma Program is a challenging two-year academic program offered to juniors and seniors that prepares students for effective participation in a rapidly evolving and increasingly global society. *Students may also enroll in IB courses without being a Diploma Candidate.*

New Visions: This program offered through Rockland BOCES is for high-achieving, college-bound seniors. This honors-level Health careers exploration participates in 21st century, real world, career-related experiences that include mentoring, job shadowing and internships working alongside doctors, nurses and nurse practitioners, speech and physical therapists, hospital administrators and other healthcare professionals during clinical and non-clinical rotations.

Rockland Community College Early Admit Program: Program for students who wish to complete their senior year by registering as full-time college students and by taking all courses at the RCC campus. High school seniors must have a GPA of 80 and place into English 101 and Math 101 to enroll. Students with a minimum GPA of an 87 are eligible for entry into the Honors Program.

Science Research: This three-year program offers students the opportunity to participate in the community of scientific research. Students will select a topic of interest and explore this topic through library research, and person-to-person conversations with scientists throughout the country. Students will develop sophisticated data collecting skills and lab skills in the development of their research question, complete a literature search, develop a hypothesis, formulate a research question, collect and analyze data, and finally present his/her findings to a *bona fide* scientific audience (e.g., Regeneron STS, NYS Science symposium, and local/regional science fairs).

Vocational Education: Rockland BOCES Career and Technical Education (CTEC) programs provide students with the opportunity to graduate high school with technical experience, professional skills and industry certifications in high-skill, high-demand fields. Classes meet 5 days a week for a half day.
