CALPADS EOY 3 & 4 CERTIFICATION

- To ensure that all enrollments for students with disabilities are exited appropriately, LEAs should certify EOY 3 and EOY 4 together
 - Ideally, LEAs should try to certify EOY 3 and EOY 4 at the same time based on a revision created on the same day, so that the information is consistent between the two submissions.
- If EOY 4 is certified prior to EOY 3 then:
 - Reports 16.22 and 16.23 (Special Education Status Reports) will NOT reflect the most accurate student enrollment exit codes.
 - Federal reporting on SWDs exiting special education will not be accurate.

UPDATING SWDS FOR GRADUATES WHO EARNED A REGULAR DIPLOMA

- Work with your SIS administrator and identify any SWDs that are high school graduates
- Ensure that these students are exited from special education in the SEDS
 - Students who graduate with a standard diploma should have a SWDS record, effective the day after their enrollment exit:
 - Status = 4 – Not Eligible
 - Non-Participation Reason Code = 30 – No Longer Eligible
- This ensures that the graduating student is attributed correctly to the SWD student group for the California School Dashboard
- Your 16.23 report will still show these students as Eligible and Participating
 - This is the intended outcome, so that students still report as eligible and participating on their last day of enrollment
 - This ensures that the student will still be counted as a SWD for End of Year reporting
 - 16.23 will not report the post-graduation SWDS of Not Eligible
 - You can use the SWDS Extract to ensure that your Students with Disabilities graduating with a diploma have the correct SWDS effective post-enrollment.
