Harmful is swallowed or absorbed through skin. Causes moderate eye irritation. Avoid contact with eyes, skin, or clothing. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling.

Pesticide product label instructions and precautions related to public safety: Avoid all areas treated until dry.

Note: as required by law, we are advising you of the following statement:

The Office of Pesticide Programs of the United States Environmental Protection Agency has stated: "Where possible, persons who potentially are sensitive, such as pregnant women, infants, and children, should avoid any unnecessary pesticide exposure."

REMEMBER: Whenever a non-low impact pesticide is used on school property there is also a Restricted Entry Interval (REI) that begins when the pesticide application ends. This Restricted Entry Interval lasts for seven hours unless the product label uses NUMERIC LANGUAGE, e.g., 4 hours or 12 hours; directing a longer or shorter period of time for Restricted Entry. If the product label does not discuss Restricted Entry the period of time defaults to seven (7) hours.
