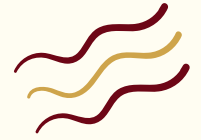

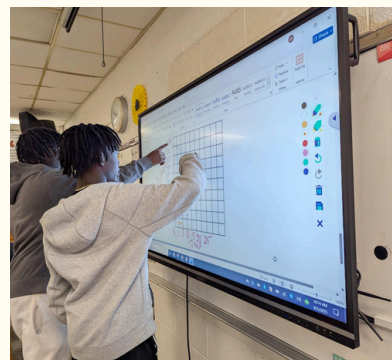

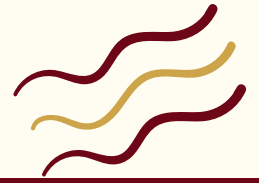
Social Studies

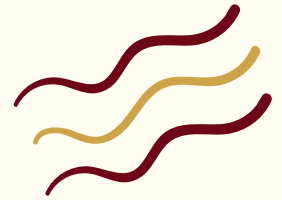


Band

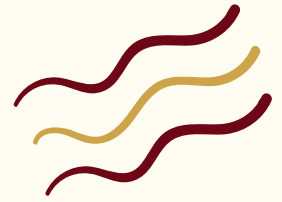

Attendance

- Attendance will be taken each day of instruction (in-person or virtual).
- All state truancy guidelines will be followed to include: parent letter, truancy meetings (virtual or in person), and truancy hearings.
- In order to receive one Carnegie unit of credit, a high school student must be in attendance at least 120 hours, per unit, regardless of the number of days missed.
- Credit for any course will be denied if a student does not meet attendance requirements. This means that any number of absences greater than 5 for a Semester course or no more than 3 for a quarter course.

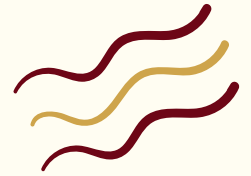
