Leadership Traits

Justice: Giving rewards and punishments according to the merits of the case in question. The ability to administer a system of rewards and punishments impartially and consistently.

Judgment: The ability to weigh facts and possible solutions on which to base sound decisions.

Dependability: The certainty of proper performance of duty.

Initiative: Taking action in the absence of orders.

Decisiveness: The ability to make decisions promptly and to announce them in a clear or forceful manner.

Tact: The ability to deal with others without creating an offense.

Integrity: Uprightness of character, soundness of moral principles, and the quality of truthfulness and honesty.

Enthusiasm: The display of sincere interest and exuberance in the performance of duty.

Bearing: Creating a favorable impression in carriage, appearance, and personal conduct at all times.

Unselfishness: Avoidance of providing for ones' own comfort and personal advancement at the expense of others.

Courage: The mental quality that recognizes fear of danger or criticism, but enables a man to proceed in the face of it with calmness and firmness.

Knowledge: Understanding of a science or an art. The range of one's information including professional knowledge and an understanding of your cadets.

Loyalty: The quality of faithfulness to country, Waite Leadership Program, and one's seniors, subordinates, and peers.

Endurance: The mental and physical stamina measured by the ability to withstand pain, fatigue, stress, and hardship.
