### ★ PATHWAY AT A GLANCE

The Education Pathway at Dinuba High School provides students with the foundational skills and knowledge to pursue careers in education. Through courses such as Life Management and Introduction to Teaching, students can earn up to 6 college credits while exploring key topics like classroom organization, curriculum planning, and teaching standards. This pathway emphasizes the historical and cultural aspects of education, focusing on educational reform, diversity in teaching, and the impact of societal issues on learning. Students participate in work-based learning experiences including guest speakers, industry tours, and internships, gaining over 75 hours of hands-on community classroom training. Graduates are well-prepared for careers as substitute teachers, paraprofessionals, school counselors, and even college professors. Students also have the opportunity to complete the CBEST, earn CPR and First Aid certification, and compete in education-related events—ensuring they are ready for both college and career success.

## COLLEGE KNOWLEDGE



Students will earn college credits, gain skills in class organization, class management, curriculum, and lesson plans. The Education sector covers a wide range of occupations from entry level careers such as an instructional aide to professional teaching and administration careers. Students can earn the required certificates, degrees, and advanced credentials at accredited colleges and universities located in the San Joaquin Valley.

Reedley College offers students many guided pathways to attaining an associate's degree in Early Childhood Education, Elementary Teacher Education, and Education & Liberal Studies. Students can transfer to a four-year university such as Fresno State or Fresno Pacific to pursue a Bachelors' degree and advanced school credential.

At Dinuba High School you can study and take classes in: Education and Child Development. Students in these pathways learn about nutrition and health, human development, and how to create lesson plans.





