
- Our programs include dance, drama, visual arts, instrumental music, vocal music, speech and debate, and a historic bagpipe program.

Dual Enrollment

EFFECTIVE INNOVATION AND COLLABORATION

4x4 Block Schedule

* * * *

- Students take 3-4 classes at a time.
- Classes are 90 minutes vs 50 minutes, affording a longer time to digest information and complete class activities.
- Teachers only teach 3 periods per day and have a 80-minute prep period.
- Teachers have about 90 students at a time rather than 175-200.
- Students take 8 classes throughout the year, instead of 6.
- The extra time in a student's schedule allows for Academic Support Classes.



Double Dosed Math & Literacy



- Students receive approximately double the amount of math instruction in Algebra I, Honors Algebra, Geometry and Algebra II.
- 10th-11th grade students may double up on honors math classes to take up to 3 years of calculus.
- Teachers across the curriculum support literacy. Teacher training has focused on literacy across disciplines.

Teacher Growth and Development

* * * *

- Six Teachers on Special Assignment (TOSAs) support teacher growth and development and implement professional development opportunities in each department.
- Teachers are assigned to Course Level Teams (professional learning communities) to collaborate on developing curriculum and implementing best instructional practices. All CLTs are provided 90 minutes of collaboration time each week.

HIGH LEVELS OF SUPPORT

Academic Support Program

 $\star\star\star\star$

- 40-50 paraprofessionals serving students on campus every day.
- Approximately 50% of students are enrolled in an academic support class during the school day.
- All students have access to 3 hours of teacher-led tutorials each week.
- 9th graders take Helix First (an intro to high school course) and Extended Learning, a support class focused on study skills, organization, and advocacy for self.

Grade Level Teams

 $\star\star\star\star$

- All students are assigned to GLTs which have a principal, counselor, academic advisor, admin assistant and social worker.
- GLTs support students' academic and social-emotional needs over all 4 years.
- GLTs meet with every family at least once a year during summer registration.

Mental Health Support

* * * *

- Dedicated Wellness Center staffed with 4 full-time licensed social workers available to students. Social workers provide support through one-on-one appointments and small group work.
- All staff and families have access to Care Solace, a free mental health referral service.
- Facility dog on campus to help with emotional support.
