Program Design (Pull Out Program, Extended Time, in-class?):	Programs are offered in a variety of formats: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● ASI for ELA and Math are offered through a pull-out program.</li> <li>● ELA and Math Academies are offered via extended day throughout the year.</li> <li>● Learning Acceleration is extended year by invite.</li> </ul>
Location of Services:	Location of services varies by program: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● ASI teachers provide services to eligible students in the student's general education class or in their own classroom.</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Academies are provided outside of the classroom at school.</li> <li>● Learning Acceleration is provided for 20 days at a central district location.</li> </ul>
Staffing:	<p>Staffing varies by program:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● ASI teachers provide instruction for the ASI pull- out program.</li> <li>● Approved ELA or Math teachers provide instruction for Literacy and Math Academies.</li> <li>● Approved ELA or Math teachers provide instruction for the summer Learning Acceleration Program.</li> </ul>
Resources:	<p>Resources vary by program:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● ASI pull-out program - Fountas and Pinnell LLI kits for ELA. Teacher made materials for mathematics.</li> <li>● Literacy and Math Academies - Sadlier's Progress for ELA. Teacher made materials for mathematics.</li> <li>● Learning Acceleration: Teacher created materials for ELA and mathematics.</li> </ul>
<b>Targeted Assistance Components</b>	
Professional Development	<p>Professional Development is offered through a variety of district providers:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● NJ Teacher 2 Teacher</li> <li>● For the Love of Literacy</li> <li>● Dr. Milou</li> <li>● Training for LLI through Heinemann as needed.</li> <li>● ASI teachers can also identify relevant external PD and apply for reimbursement using title funding.</li> </ul>
Parental Involvement	<p>Parents are involved in a number of ways:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● An annual ASI evening event is held using a workshop model with topics to provide parents strategies to support students at home.</li> <li>● Communication is provided at Back to School Night about our programs.</li> <li>● Communication is sent when students are identified as needing or found to be eligible (Academy invite).</li> <li>● Parental involvement in RTI meetings.</li> </ul>
