

MILAN SURPRISES LADY CAV VOLLEYBALLERS; MIDDLE SCHOOL SOCCER BLANKS TRENTON 5-0

Back on August 28, Milan's volleyball team extended Crockett County to five sets before the Lady Cavs squeaked out a victory. Thursday night, the tables turned.

The Lady Bulldogs knocked off visiting Crockett 25-17, 10-25, 26-24, and 25-19 to claim their triumph. Coach Andrew Laman's Lady Cavs, except for their solid second set, were often a victim of their own errors in the other three and had their three-match winning streak snapped as the team dropped to 16-6 for the season.

Crockett will try to regroup before hosting two matches next Tuesday and Thursday against Dyersburg and Covington, respectively.

MIDDLE SCHOOL SOCCER: Seventh-grader Kalynn Lewis drilled in four goals for the second straight match as CCMS went on the road Thursday evening and blanked Trenton 5-0. Lewis had also netted four shots in a 5-4 win over Martin in the team's previous contest. Olivia Barger scored the remaining goal against Trenton, and Caleigh Howell recorded the other goal in the Martin game for Coach Alex Taylor's club.

HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL: Crockett will try to bounce back from last week's heartbreaking loss to Dyer County when it hosts Region 7-4A foe Hardin County tonight at Cavalier Stadium. The Cavs are 1-1 in Region play, as are five other teams. Hardin is 0-2 in the Region, while Dyer County leads the pack with a 2-0 mark. Coach Kevin Ward's crew is 3-1 overall for the season. Game time is 7 p.m.
