Student Learning

Problem Statement 1: Current core subject areas lacks a consistent, data informed approach to identifying and addressing student learning gaps, limiting growth in STAAR Meets and Masters performance areas. **Root Cause:** There is an inconsistent use of common formative assessments, in core subjects, aligned to priority standards , and limited structures for timely data analysis and instructional response in collaborative teams, resulting in missed opportunities for student growth.

Problem Statement 1: Too many classroom-based discipline referrals are disrupting instructional time and student learning, indicating a need for more effective classroom management strategies and proactive behavior supports. **Root Cause:** Many teachers lack consistent implementation of Tier 1 and Tier 2 behavior strategies due to insufficient training, limited support structures, and inconsistent feedback systems for behavior. management.
