What is Title I?

- **Federally-funded program**
- **Designed to reinforce the basic and advanced skills of students.**
- **Part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) passed by Congress in 2015.**

How is a school selected for Title I?

- Title I schools are selected based on the number of students participating in the free and reduced lunch program. However, all students at the campus receive the benefits of the extra funds.

How are Title I funds used?

- 25-26 = **\$999,505**

 - **Course fees, Cert exams, AP test, dual credit tuition.**


Counselor Office Request Slips

FAFSA

Free Application for Federal AID

- Enrolling in college or career educational program
- Student has a valid Social Security Number
- Complete application online at [Studentaid.gov](https://studentaid.gov)

TASFA

Texas Application for State Financial Aid

- Enrolling in college or career educational program
- Student does not have a valid Social Security Number
- Lived in Texas for 3 years before graduation

Parent Opt-Out

- Going into the military or not attending a college or career educational program
- Parents choose not to complete FAFSA/TASFA
- Contact your student's counselor for Parent Opt-Out form

CCMR Requirements

College, Career, Military Readiness

How can my child earn a CCMR point?

College Readiness

- Earn 3 hours of dual credit math or english or 9 hours dual credit in other subjects
- CARE Academy (Advanced Algebra & English 4 K,L,SSL, ICS)
- Earn a 3,4,5 on one AP test
- Earn associate degree
- Earn a qualifying score on the SAT, ACT or TSIA2
- SPED with complete IEP & workforce readiness or SPED with Advanced Degree Plan

Career Readiness

- Earn an Industry Based Certification along with completing the CTE pathway with 3 or more courses for 4 credits. With one course being an advanced CTE Course.

Military Readiness

- Enlist in the military with a completed DD 4

College Readiness Benefits

Graduate will not have to take remedial classes in college, thus saving time and money


Career Readiness Benefits
