- 4,000 Teachers, Support Staff and Administrators
- 62 Buildings (50 schools)

EDUCATION FUND REVENUE

- Foundation Non-Virtual = \$6,967
- Foundation Virtual = \$5,922 (85%)
 - Provides basic level of support to all students
 - All districts get the same per pupil
- Complexity = \$1,053
 - Provides additional support to students
- Basic Grant Per Student Allocation = \$8,020
- Basic Grant Per Virtual Student = \$6,817 (85%)
- Estimated Non-Virtual Enrollment = 26,826
- Estimated Virtual Enrollment = 449

2025/26 Anticipated Basic Grant Total = \$218,205,353





Facilities & Maintenance Statistics:

- Average age of buildings 60+ years
- FWCS spans over 145.7 square miles and CPP helps maintain:
 - o 900 acres of grass to mow
 - 4 million square feet of roofs
 - Nearly 4 million square feet of snow plowing
 - o 3,700 doors

- 194 boilers and 4,000 pieces
 of HVAC equipment
- o 3,000 clocks
- 30,000 light fixtures
- 9,000 plumbing fixtures


