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Accreditation and Memberships

The Anglo-American School of Sofia is accredited by The Council of International Schools (CIS) and The New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC). We are an authorized International Baccalaureate Organization (IB) World School. The Anglo-American School of Sofia is a member of good standing with the Central Eastern European Schools Association (CEESA), the Council of British International Schools (COBIS) and the European Council of International Schools (ECIS).

The School

The Anglo-American School of Sofia is the primary international school in Bulgaria's capital city. Founded in 1967 as an elementary and middle school, AAS moved into a purpose-built, LEED-certified campus in 2006 and inaugurated the high school in the same year. AAS provides a high-quality education to the children of the international diplomatic and business communities residing in Sofia, along with local students seeking an international school education. With the support of the American and British embassies, AAS has continuously pursued the ongoing improvement of its programs. This includes increasing support for students with diverse learning needs and styles. With 600 students from 60 countries, AAS emphasizes building global citizenship and inclusion in the community.

The Students & Faculty

In the high school, there are 194 students representing 36 countries. Students from Bulgaria make up approximately 35% of the student body, followed by the USA (16%), and Russia (7%). There are 60 students in grade 12.

There are 51 middle and high school teaching staff from around the world, 90% of whom have advanced degrees. The most represented countries are the USA (45%), Bulgaria (29%), and the UK (12%).

The Curriculum

The AAS curriculum is based on a traditional U.S. high school model with the International Baccalaureate Diploma Program introduced in the last two years of high school. All students graduate with an American-accredited high school diploma. The majority of students will earn the IB Diploma. Of the 60 seniors, 54 are in the IBDP, and six are on the US high school diploma pathway or hybrid.

The IB Program

AAS offers 21 IBDP courses. All courses are offered at SL/HL levels unless otherwise stated.

Students are permitted to take self-study IB “A” Languages and online IB courses through Pamoja when not offered at AAS.

Non-IB Diploma Students

Students not pursuing the full IB Diploma will earn the American-accredited high school diploma. These students are enrolled in IB-based courses, with the general exception of English and Mathematics, though there may be individual exceptions in certain cases. Non-IB Diploma students are eligible to sit exams in individual IB courses. For any IB-based course in which the student's work is internally assessed, the course will appear as a 12th-grade course on the transcript (e.g. “IB Geometry SL” becomes “Geometry 12”).

Students not seeking the IB Diploma complete a modified version of the IB Core: students take TOK (internally assessed), complete a personal project in place of the Extended Essay, and have lighter CAS requirements. The Core of the IBDP is referred to on the transcript as the “Senior Project.”

Grading System


